

Holy Lent, St. Marks -

The year is marching on and February brings us into Lent.

We had an amazing annual meeting and wonderful potluck, and I am so grateful for the leadership of St. Mark's: those who are stepping off the Vestry, those who are joining, and all who do so many ministries around St. Mark's. We'll be starting the new vestry's time with us with a group retreat before we hit the ground running and planning. The energy is kinetic around church and I am so excited for the next year.



Settling in and moving through the Christmas season leads us, first of all, to Lent. There will be a number of opportunities for education and faith exploration.

- Ash Wednesday service will be at 6:30pm with the distribution of Ashes
- Wednesdays during Lent, starting with March 1st, will have 5pm soup and bread. There is a sign-up sheet in the narthex if you are willing to bring the soup or the bread. We will be discussing Rowan Williams' book about being disciples during our soup supper.
- Following that at 6:30pm we will have stations of the cross and Eucharist.

Thursday February 23rd will be our next home Eucharist and potluck. There is currently nobody signed up to host so we will once again be meeting at church. Eucharist starts at 6pm, food to follow. Meat of the month is whole oven roasted chicken.

It is an ancient Christian tradition to do a spiritual work or sacrifice during Lent – what we traditionally know as "giving something up for lent". I highly encourage you to adopt a spiritual practice or sacrifice for Lent. Additionally, an under used sacrament in the Episcopal church is the sacrament of confession. Personally, I try and go to confession at least twice a year. It's a good chance to clear the slate and start anew. I am available by appointment to hear confessions any time of the year, but especially during this Holy season.



St. Mark's Episcopal Church Vestry Meeting Minutes December 11th, 2022

Members Present: Fr. Mike, Fred Ellis, Joann Ellis, Linda Zamzow, Jody Langfeldt, Christine Merrill, Kevin Luebke, Maison Yaroch, Ken Peters

Meeting Started: 10:50 AM

Chris moves to move the Jr. Warden's report up Kevin seconds

Fr Mike opens in prayer

Jr. Warden's Report

- 1. Nativity Crèche is up, has power at night, mentioned putting a star on top
- 2. Women's Bathroom the heater is in, Ken just needs to build a frame around it as it could not be put in the wall
- 3. Glass Window Done, on/off switches are in
- 4. Getting ice remover or salt today (12/11/22) for the sidewalk
- 5. Microphone Ken says the switch in the one we have now is shot, a new one is \$135
 - a. Joann motions we spend the \$135 + shipping for the microphone, take it out of line item 550?
 - b. Linda seconds this motion
- 6. Storage Loft go through it, clear out some stuff that we don't use
- 7. Fireplace on hold but Ken has already had people come up to him who would like to donate
- 8. 16 new bulbs, 8 burnt out, we're using LEDs now
- 9. Contract for paving was sent by Maison after the last vestry meeting
- **10. Candelabras** Historically we put them around the poinsettias, but Linda asked if we want to move them to either side of the stained glass window in the narthex instead. Ken Peters is going to melt the wax off the candelabras and repaint.
- **11. John Mining** says he has never done a contract for his plowing before, doesn't think it's necessary now. He will be doing the plowing though
- 12. Stakes are up for the plow
- 13. New TV will be arriving for where the vestry meets next week (the week after this meeting)

Linda Has Questions About November Minutes - asks if the members who are absent should be listed, other members think yes

Chris moves we approve minutes of November meeting Joann seconded Motion carried

Treasurer's Report

Fr. Mike called Mark Brehmer at this point so he could be a part of the financial section of the meeting

- 410 Current Pledges Contributions Under \$21,977.19
- **412 Giver of Record –** Over by \$8,838
- 512 / 512.1 Rector's Pension Under Budget \$1,152.74 (this is a quarterly item)
- 513 Health Insurance Under Budget \$1,666.67
- **1.** Joann asks about **418 Miscellaneous –** \$982.25 "somebody paid for something" Fred doesn't remember what off the top of his head, but it was Ken
- 2. Got \$50 today for flowers and some money came in last week
- 3. Flowers & Greens & Trees & Wreaths Before Covid was \$578.30

440.9.6 – Sympathy Loss of Loved One – \$715

a. Linda wonders if we have to ask those who gave the money if we can use it for specific things, like paying a little off on the nativity scene. Fred says it's up to the vestry.

- **b.** Mark asks if we should use it towards Christmas decorations instead, decorations could be dedicated to family members.
- **c.** Fr. Mike thinks it should go towards the Christmas trees & flowers. He asks if we want to move it into the Flower Fund. Joann asks if we should ask people first
- **d.** Fr. Mike wonders where we should look for that information, Joann suggests asking Karen. We've had the money for a while so no one seems to know where it has come from or who to ask about it
- 1. Working on putting two line items together as quickbooks adds .1 lines where not necessary
- 2. Outreach was in the minutes for the last meeting

Jody asks if someone would like to accept the report Linda accepts

Finance Committee Meeting - Pledge at \$44,000 - We got in over \$55,000

- a. Two showed up in the office after the \$44,000 was announced
- **b.** \$44,580 as of Wednesday night's financial meeting
- c. \$55,680 ACTUAL PLEDGE MONEY
- **1.** Joann asked if the budget amount should be raised. It is thought, initially by those in the finance committee, that we shouldn't. Mark suggests we raise it to \$60,000 as that is the "guesstimate" of what we'll end up getting
 - **a. 413 Loose Offerings –** left at \$1,000
 - **b. 414 Special -** left at \$200
 - c. 415 Donations Donations and gifts cant be budgeted
- **d. 416 Fundraiser** upped to \$5000, Joann asks if we should up that more since we made so much at the cookie walk. Because of rising prices it is decided it should be kept the same
 - e. 417 Flowers & Candles upped to \$500
 - **f. 511 Rectors Comp –** \$64061
 - g. 512 Rector's Pension Percentage of Rector's compensation, projected \$11,531
 - h. 514 Rector's Travel Already spent \$2643.06 so it was upped to \$3000
 - i. 515 Supply Priest left at \$1,500
 - j. Supply Priest Travel Allowance left at \$900
 - k. 518 Workmen's Compensation Kept at \$350
- I. 519 Misc. (Lawn & Snow) Being charged \$20 more per time now, making it \$85, so the budget total was upped to ???
 - m. 541 Diocesan Conventions Upped \$1000 as it cost us \$1183 this time
 - n. 542 Heat/Lights/Water Upped to 6,000 as we spent \$4460 on these things this year
 - o. 543 Telephone Kept at \$240, it costs \$20 a month with internet
 - p. 544.1 Copier Lowered to \$1000, we're on an ink program and it's cheaper
 - q. 544.2 Postage Haven't spent much on postage this year
 - Jody presented a receipt for the postage used for cookie walk postcards
 - r. 544.3 Stationary As Needed
 - **s. 544.4 Internet –** left at \$2500
 - t. 544.5 Payroll Services Upped to \$350 as we are already at \$315 for the year
 - **u. 544.7 Paypal Fees –** Lowered to \$100
 - v. 544.9 Office Supplies Kept at \$500 as we are already at \$362

- Fred says he has to get paper because Maison keeps using it
- w. 545.1 Audit We haven't heard anything from the diocese, they haven't charged us
- **x. 545.2 Software –** Kept at \$300
- y. 546 Fundraiser Expenses Spent \$200 so it is being kept at \$200
- z. 549 Special Events & Occasions \$90
- **z² 551 Building Maintenance –** left at \$1000
- z³ 552 Major Improvement Left at \$500
- 1. Reminder that we won't have to worry about a furnace fund next year since we have a furnace
 - a² 553 Miscellaneous Kept at \$500. It's currently at \$288.86 but Ken is going to go out and by lights
 - **b**² **554 Property insurance –** Quarterly thing. That's all that was said.
 - c²561 Choir Spent \$90 for new choirmaster book
 - d² 562 Altar Supplies Kept at \$500, we bought new vestment
 - e² 563 Flowers Kept at \$450, rely on donations
 - f² 565 Bulletin Inserts Kept at \$300
 - g² 566 Books & Resources Kept at \$100
 - h² 567 Fellowship Kept at \$250
- i² 568 Ads & Advertising Spent \$144.03. It costs \$41 for newspaper advertising, falls under this line item or fundraising. Those in charge of the facebook will be "pushing" more adverts
 - j² 571 Church School Kept at \$200
 - k² 572 Rector's Continuing Education Spent 4375, left AT \$600
- I² 573 Evangelism Left at \$100. It is currently over budget by \$900 because we had to pay Mitch

McVicker

- m² 574 Adult Education \$50
- n² 575 Seminarian Support Left at \$1000
- o² 576 Stewardship Left at \$50
- p² 611 Organist Upped to \$10,000
- **a.** Mark asks if that's a guess, Fred says yes because we don't know how many Sundays Lizzie is going to play.
- Fr. Mike wants to get somebody from Wayland so we have somebody aside from Lizzie
- **b.** We already paid out \$7500 this year, there's only 3 weeks left says Mark, but Fred notes she's been here for services she wouldn't normally since they were special occasions (like bishop lees visit)
- **1.** Joann asks if we're going to have another finance meeting before annual meeting. Fr. Mike thinks finance committee should meet before next vestry meeting
- 2. Getting an electronics technician was brought up
 - q² 612 Administrative Assistant Upped to \$9000
 - r² 600 Childcare Provider \$1000
 - s^2 600 Payroll expenses \$1500
- **1.** Jody asked when Fr. Mike is due for sabbatical because we need to cover the expenses. It is 5-7 years out, he's leaning towards 5
- **2.** Joann thinks we should keep the current projected budget as is for now and look it over at the next finance meeting January 11th at 4:30PM. By then we should have all pledges in and all year-end finance information

Cookie Walk – \$1930, counting isn't finished at this point as not all money is in

- a. edit: \$10 arrived during the meeting, making the current total \$1940
- b. edit #2: two other payments were factored in, though we still have not received them as of this meeting, making

the total \$1973.05

- c. Jody asks where the 10% from the cookie walk will go, no decision was made
- **d.** Over all went exceptionally well. Joann and Fred left at 11:30, Fr. Mike was still selling cookies to the random stragglers that came in at that point

Correspondence

- 1. Got a check from Texas Roadhouse \$15.55 (goes in discretionary fund)
- **2.** Received paperwork to do tree of lights at beaver dam hospital, if we want to. They will take responses until December 31st. Vestry wasn't enthused with the idea
- **3.** Anne Wilson Cook Book Received Jody will call historical society and see if they want it, if not we'll keep it.
- 4. Episcopal Relief & Development You can send them contributions
 - a. \$25 buys flock of chickens, \$20 per share buy a pig, etc.

Directory Update – Almost finished with the second draft, when it is complete it will be put down in the narthex so people can check their information. Hard copies will be emailed out when the final draft is done. A few copies will be placed in the narthex as well

New Business

- 1. Need to be looking for nominations for Sr. Warden, Jr. Warden, and two vestry members at least
 - a. replacing Erin was brought up, Jody will call and ask her if she wants to be removed
 - **b.** Joann timed out at 6 years, Chris has another year, Linda is on 2nd year of 3 year term.
- **c.** Ken doesn't want to be Jr Warden after this year. He will continue to do the work he has been doing, but he will not attend the meetings.
 - d. Fr. Mike wants to get a Jr. Warden that will be able to attend entire meetings
 - e. We currently don't know where Dave Drexler sits on the matter of his seat, someone will talk to him
- **f.** Several people were brought up as possibilities for new members, they will be reached out to by current vestry members
 - g. No suggestions for Jr. Warden yet
 - h. Maison was brought up but cannot be Jr. Warden because they are clerk of vestry
- **2. Annual Meeting** Maison does the agenda for the annual meeting, which they weren't aware of. Joann will help with this.
- **a.** It was decided reports should be to Maison by the 12th of January. Any report that is late will not be included (So says Linda)
 - b. Stewardship Report Linda & Kevin "I think Fr. Mlke was in there somewhere"
 - c. ECW Report Joann
 - **d. Jr. Warden Report** (there were no Jr. Warden's at this meeting to decide)
 - e. Sr. Warden Report annual minutes are done
 - f. Website Report Fr. Mike
 - g. Columbarium Report Dave Drexler usually does it but there's nothing to report yet as of 12/11/22
 - h. Fellowship Outreach Report Fr. Mike, Joann will help
 - i. Deacon's report don't need
 - j. Organ nothing changed

- **3. Eucharistic Ministers** James Cleary and Meredith Harmon were listed but haven't been to St. Marks in over a year. We need new ones
- 4. We need acolytes and chalice bearers
- 5. This entire topic has been tabled for next year (2023)

 - a. Andrea will be working with us on the phone app
- 2. Paul Lampert's Window Tabled for next year
- **3.** Use of Ministry Grant Update Waiting for metrosound to get back to Fr. Mike. Tabled.
- **4. Online Store** open at the time of this meeting but is set to close the 26th. Fr. Mike will be calling to ask if it can be kept open through the new year.
- **a.** We'll be opening it up for short windows of time as the company doesn't let their sites remain open continuously
- **b.** It was suggested we keep it open through the first of year and then open it again somewhere in February or March
 - c. Items could be shifted depending on season / what people want
- 5. Nativity Company sent a new lamb, old one was cracked, so now we have two
- 6. Talent Auction Final Income Nobody seems to have any idea
- 7. Mitch McVicker is going to send us a W9 because he has to
- **8.** Fr. Mike wants vestry to start pondering a vestry retreat, perhaps for some time in February after the new members are in
- 9. Old Facebook will be deleted after the new site is up
- 10. Fr. Mike would like the vestry to consider allowing him to do actual midnight mass next year

Fr. Mike read the House Allowance for 2023 Linda moved to accept the allowance Joann & Chris second Motion Carried


