


## **Reception of Wine at Holy Eucharist**

Meeting Started: 11:05 AM

Fr. Mike opens with prayer
Linda read a devotional / stewardship prayer

Joann moves to accept the minutes as corrected Linda seconded. Motion carried.

#### **Treasurer's Report**

#### **Old Business**

**Choir Update** - ready for their song next Sunday (Bishop's visit)

Altar Guild Booklet - no update Carol Starr's last name needs to be added

**Directory Update** - picture directory update on hold due to new website & lack of pictures, Maison will eventually get updated pictures. For now there is a new / updated text directory that Maison will be sending out

#### **New Business**

**Living Compass Update** - Scheduled for Thursdays at 6:30, will begin with soup. Corporate zoom is available, but we may not do that during our gathering, we will be doing our own thing. Starts December 1<sup>st</sup>

**Outreach Funds Distribution** – Fred didn't have an exact number. Guesstimate is \$1547 - 10% of our fundraisers + what we budget for outreach can be distributed

**Beaver Dam Community Hospital** - never cashed their check last year, but it might be due to something messed up during the switch on Marshfield's end. Unsure.

#### **Donation Conversation -**

- 1. Joann suggests we donate some to PAVE
- 2. Fr. Mike asks about donating some to Loaves & Fishes
- 3. Joann suggests we look at that during our next annual meeting, so it encompasses the entire congregation and not just the Vestry
- 4. Donate now as a vestry but in 2023 figure out donation / volunteers for Loaves & Fishes
- 5. Donated previously to food pantry in the past, Cribs program (provides pack-n-plays)
- 6. Fred asks if we want to give a little to a lot, or a lot to a little. Linda suggests fewer people but more money per person
- 7. Jody suggests we donate \$500 to new women's shelter PAVE, \$500 to Loaves and Fishes, and divide \$547 between all three food pantries (St. Vincent's, Community Action Coalition, Restore)

Joann seconded. Motion carried.

Kevin suggests there be an item on January's agenda to make an outreach plan

#### **575 - Seminarian Support -** \$279

Christine moves we send the remainder of the money in line item 575 to Nashota House Linda seconded. Motion carried.

**Bishop Lee's Reception** - Extended coffee hour, get a cake (have confirmation & reception written on it maybe? edit: 'congratulations, welcome home' was decided upon) Joann will be in charge of the cake and all Vestry Members are contributing other items. Ordering through Piggly Wiggly, will be buying scrip to pay for it. Linda will pick it up Saturday afternoon.

#### **Rector's Report**

**Stonehouse Digital Update** - We (Andrea, Fr. Mike, and Maison) keep meeting up to work on it. It's almost where we want it to be. Joann suggests adding 'Back to Top' options, or putting the menu on the bottom as well as the top.

Paul Lampert Window - Ken and Betsy are going to look at stained glass.

Ministry Grants - We have received both

**Online Store** - Is up, people have started ordering from it. Fr. Mike wants to get more items added to it as well as a Team Tess shirt

Fireside Trip - "looking awesome"

Feil's Trip - "went great"

**Nativity** - Scene has been ordered. Over half of it accounted for. Fr. Mike would like to tell the congregation as we are short on the amount needed

Final Income from the Talent Auction - Had another check come in on it. guesstimate of \$1000

#### Fr. Mike

- 1. (who is three quarters time) averaging 9.5 blocks a week
- **2.** Is leaving on Thursday before Bishop's visit to help a friends daughter move, plans on being back Saturday but has contingencies in place if that looks like it's not going to happen.
- **3.** Fred asks if we give the Bishop anything, Fr. Mike said we give him the loose offerings but we mail them to him later, we don't give them to him the day of his visit. Announcement will be made during church
- **4.** Will be taking David Genereaux to meet Carolyn Senn to connect base with the Diocese over the records

#### Jr. Warden's Report

**Air Conditioning** - Is in, along with the air filtration option, and it works. It was less than we thought it would be and will be paid for soon

**Stained Glass Window** – Took several people to get it in but it is in. Ken and Dave framed it with wood and it's lit. They were given \$350 from the vestry to put it together and "I don't think we hit even \$100 bucks"

**TV** - Will be moved from the Lion's Den upstairs to where we now hold Vestry meetings. edit: Ken has an old tv that he will be donating instead

- 3. Linda called the plow guy; John Mining. he'll be doing it. \$65 was the old price, new price will be \$85 per time
- **4.** Looking at fireplace

**Cookie Walk** - Jody will be picking up stamps, Maison made flyers and postcards, and postcards will be going out soon. Not enough people have signed up yet to bake but that usually happens and changes, according to Linda. Maison will be posting the new flyer on the new Facebook so people can share it from there. Kevin will be playing music

**Christmas Flowers** – Maison should put something in the bulletin about donating for Christmas flowers. Linda Zamzow will get greens and trees from Woodils

**Old Frontal** - Linda requested permission to take it to the dry cleaners (its water stained), due to concerns that it could fall apart. Fr. Mike and the vestry have given permission, because we can't use it anyway if it's dirty


