## Vestry Meeting Minutes April 23rd, 2023

Fr. Mike opens with prayer

Deb motions to approve the March minutes as is Seconded by Carolyn All say I

### **Treasurers Report**

**Horicon Bank** – \$9635. 18 **250.2** – **Tech Fund** – \$2000

- 263 Lenten's Offers/Good Friday \$75 got for good Friday offering
- \*Fred will look and see if the bill for the easter flowers has shown up yet
- \*we got the bill for the Christmas flowers late
- 440.2.2 Outdoor Nativity We got another thousand dollars that came in later
- **440.92 Church Excursions** spent 1744.50 discrepancy of 600 dollars (all the money came in, but it didn't all come in at the same time so it was just counted at different times)
- **512 Rector's Pension** \$136 behind on pension, we pay the bill when it comes in, how they divide the year and how we do it is two different things
- **a.** Kevin asked why there are two lines for pension. Fred says it was corrected but he will bring it up to Karen again
- 514 Rector's Travel Under budget \$461.27
- 515 Supply Priest Under budget \$250
- 519 Snow & Lawn \$245.01 over
- **541 Heat/Lights/Water** 7680.07 over
- **611 Organist** Over budget \$412.50 due to having extra services
  - a. We will be paying both organists (Lizzie & Emma) out of the same line item
- **612 Administrative Assistant** Under budget \$9.60

Fr. Mike's compensation was approved in the budget for 2022 – This was brought up and discussed because some members could not remember

**The Coffee Money Fund** – "Coffee Money" is a catch-all name for coffee makers, nescos, fridges, stoves, etc. Mark considers that building maintenance and suggests it should go under the building maintenance line. Deb suggests we define the fund better, Fr. Mike thinks we should rename it.

**a.** According to **259.9 – Coffee Money** – we have \$1399.69. Mark suggests we maintain a \$500 balance in there, like a sort of emergency fund. This line item was created when we were buying from fairtrade, way back.

- Altar Guild Maison is finishing typing up the new booklet
- 2. Magnets & Pens Jody & Fr. Mike are working on it
- **a.** Regarding the design: Carolyn suggests we use the crest since that's what we use on everything else. It is unifying and makes us easily recognizable
- 3. Nametags On hold due to the problem with the whiteboards
  - a. It's \$25 a sheet for sheet metal to cover the whiteboards
- **b.** Ken will take a nametag to Office Depot to see what kind of board holds the nametags best. He will then go and get it somewhere else for cheaper
- 4. Adventures -

**Quarterly Adventures** – Make sure we identify them as 'adult only' **Mexico Mission Trip** – Make sure we identify this as 'youth'

- **a.** This year we've added parish adventures like quarterly adult trips, family events like joyful noise, and a youth mission trip. We should have something for everyone. We will brainstorm on this later again

  - a. Karen has set up an email for finance and is going to set up one for office

- **11. Safe Church Training Reminder** Anyone in a leadership role or who will be interacting quite a bit with people involved in the church, especially younger people, must take this training. It's an online program, Fr. Mike will get the rest of the information and send it out
- 12. Dementia Informational Meeting Will be the Sunday after this meeting before worship committee
- **13. Active Violence and Response Training** It's next Saturday from this meeting. If we don't have anyone signed up Fr. Mike has to get a hold of the diocese. No one at the meeting was interested
- 14. Talent Fair Kept on the agenda so we keep it in front of us

### **Rectors Report**

#### 1. Church Music

a. "We're getting musicians, not organists". Lizzie will teach Emma to play organ. Fr. Mike just summarizes

everything about this topic from the last meeting

- **b.** Considering other instruments, like guitar / flute / violin ("probably not sax" Mark)
- 2. Reboot of Ministerium Will probably be happening in May
- 3. Joyful Noise
  - a. We have an insurance certificate from church insurance
  - b. Bandshell & shelter are reserved
  - c. One of the other churches participating has created a poster
- **d.** The committee for this event are going to start soliciting for corporate sponsors; like asking Culvers to do root beer floats & Piggly Wiggly to give food. Fr. Mike suggested we could display the sponsors names on a big board
- **e.** Games, a dunk tank, and a bounce house have been lined up. People will get a ticket for every activity they do & with that ticket they get a chance to win a prize basket.
  - f. It's a rain or shine event.
- **4. Bishop Lee's Visit** Fr. Mike just summarizes the section of his newsletter article on this
- **5. VBS** Our church has been invited to a vacation bible school at Lakeview Park. It's the 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> of June year
- **6. Time Off** Questions about the categories of time off and "what counts as what" were asked. The time taken off so far this year has been due to Fr. Mike's mom's death so no, that does not count as vacation time. The time taken off for the trip to Mexico also does not count as vacation time because it is a mission trip.


