Hello St. Mark's,

As the year continues to fly by, I want to give you all a special invitation to the Lenten opportunities available during this Lent.

We are having soup, bread, and book study starting March 1st at 5pm with stations of the cross and Eucharist at 6:30pm. The book we will be reading is "Being Disciples" by the retired Archbishop of Canterbury Rowan Williams. If you're interested books are available in the narthex at church.

Thursday March 9th @ 6pm we will be having a reconciliation service at church. This will be a brief service of scripture, song, and prayer with a chance for individual confession afterwards if people wish to go to



confession. Many people in the Episcopal church don't know that confession is actually a sacrament of ours. It isn't required ever, but it is an excellent chance to start anew and move past the sin and burden that can keep us from fully experiencing God's love. What better time is there to do that then Lent?

Our home eucharist will be at the church March 16th from 5 till 8, hosted by Fred & Joanne Ellis as we all Lilly: their dog and a frequent attendee at Wednesday worship. The meat will be pulled pork, please bring a dish to pass. Eucharist will start at 6:15pm with supper to follow.

There is a sign up in the narthex across from the bathrooms for bringing soup & bread for Lenten Wednesdays, as well as for reading or serving during Holy Week in April. We're having a night-watch on Maundy Thursday from right after the service until daybreak. You can participate in person or online. Time slots can be signed up for on the holy week signup sheet.

You may notice the crosses covered, the sand in the baptistry, and the holy water fonts by the main church doors. These are to help us enter into the desert of Lent. The grittiness of Lent will help us sharpen, smooth, and shine ourselves so as we come through into Easter light we will glimmer like the son we follow.

I am praying for you in my deepest prayer this Lent. God bless you as we take this journey.

Miracles Among Us

Do you wonder if miracles still happen? Have you ever seen one? They are all around us. Volunteering for an organization is a good place to see them and to be one. Many of us here at St. Mark's do volunteer work in and outside of the church. We might consider that what we do doesn't have much impact, but much of the time our contribution of time and talent is built upon the volunteer ahead or behind us. Eastern Star is a great example. Saving aluminum pull tabs from cans may not seem like a very big deal or very important but you add yours to everyone else's in church and it becomes quite a contribution over time. Our representative to Eastern Star is Vanda Wiegert. She adds ours to others she collects and drives them to a collection sight in Madison. They are then added to many more Eastern Star collectors. The Shriners then sell them and use the funds to purchase therapy for children using a new prothesis or walkers at a Shriner's hospital.

UTO is another example of miracles today. We put coins in a box for blessings received which are then added to others in the diocese. The funds are then added to all Episcopal diocese across the nation. The National church distributes the money in the form of grants to any Episcopal church that applies for one. The average collected is two million dollars per year. Here at St. Mark's we donated \$418.16 in 2022. The collection is taken here in May and November. Vanda Wiegert is also the person to talk to for information about this outreach.

So you can see that all of us together really are a miracle to someone we may not even know, and as God says, "That's the way it's done."



For an Epiphany blessing, chalk the door with 'holy graffiti'

Episcopal churches adopt ancient tradition

From the Epiphany and continuing for days to come, more and more Episcopalians are joining other Christians around the world in writing this ancient yet ever-changing formula on their doors: 20+C+M+B+23.

The numbers, letters and symbols have been called "holy graffiti," and some people suggest the combination looks like the start of an algebraic equation.

The letters C, M, B come from the traditional names for the wise men: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar, whose arrival at Mary and Joseph's

home is celebrated on the <u>Epiphany</u>. (Tradition also says that three men visited the infant Jesus because the gospel writer Matthew, the only one who describes such a visit but does not number them, says they brought three gifts, gold, frankincense, and myrrh. Their names appear in a Greek manuscript from 500 AD translated into Latin, which many biblical scholars consider the source of the <u>names</u>.) The letters are also an abbreviation for "Christus Mansionem Benedicat," which means "May Christ bless this dwelling." The first and last numbers refer to the current year, and the plus signs in between represent the cross

Haiti Partnership New

Classes Have Started at St. Marc School Jeannette. We are delighted to tell you that, after a delayed opening due to the fuel crisis, St. Marc School opened to great fanfare on November 7! It

was one of the first schools to reopen this year, and students, teachers, and parents alike rejoiced!

The last few months have been some of the most difficult times people in Haiti have ever experienced. Food shortages, due in part to the gang barricade of the port in Port-au-Prince and of major roads (including the one to

Jeannette), coupled with rampant inflation, have left Haiti in what the United Nations has declared to be a situation of "catastrophic hunger." Now that the growing season has ended and Jeannette is entering the dry period, Jeannette's people are also experiencing food insecurity. Please prayerfully consider donating today to support the school and clinic that are so vital to the people of Jeannette.

From the Episcopal Wisconsin Trialogue Frequently Asked Questions

FAQ #1: What is under consideration by the trialogue?



In the 21st century, the church faces a changing landscape. Our society is becoming increasingly secular and commitment to the church is no longer a given. One way or another, the church must adapt to better engage the world with the resurrection hope we have in Jesus Christ.

The trialogue is considering reunion of the three Episcopal dioceses in Wisconsin into one diocese. A Steering Committee is coordinating the various task forces to examine what is needed for building such a proposal. No specific proposal has been developed yet.

At the end of 2020, the bishops of the Diocese of Eau Claire and the Diocese of Milwaukee both retired, which resulted in two of the three dioceses of Wisconsin being without bishops. That presented what seems like an opportunity to explore the future of the Episcopal Church in Wisconsin. The opportunity is providential. Might the Holy Spirit be inviting us to look afresh at being the church in our time? How might our combined assets – financial and human resources – be used to support each of our existing congregations and encourage the beginning of new congregations or communities that might look more or less like church as we know it? Or perhaps even communities of faith that look quite different from the church as we know it today? How might we be better public witnesses and agents of hope in Wisconsin? The time is right to look at these and other questions.


