

Hello St. Mark's,

Fall is here. The Harvest, the changing of the colors, and celebrating God's bounty. We have had a busy summer and have hit the fall full force. We are starting confirmation class a few weeks later than planned but class is starting Sept 25th and continuing through October. In November Bishop Lee will be with us for confirmation and reception.

October will be our busiest month yet in our time together. We have the diocesan convention in early October in Milwaukee and then the talent auction from Oct 2nd through Oct 16th. There will be tables set up in the narthex with talents to be bid on. Some items will be presented, like paintings and wood carvings, and some will be a description of the talent, like cleaning or dinner with your Rector:)



Taking place in the middle of our talent auction we have a concert right here at St. Mark's. Tuesday Oct 11th at 7PM, come see Mitch McVicker - a Christian artist that will engage you with his unique style of storytelling and song. It's a free concert, although there will be a plate for donations if you would like to / are able to give. Snacks will be served afterwards (also free) so bring along some friends and have fun!

Our talent auction ends Oct 16th. Those with the highest bid will win the talent being offered. Checks can be made out to St. Mark's talent auction on the memo line or you can pay online.

We will be celebrating baptisms on October 2nd and blessing of the animals Oct 9th (more about that in about 3 pages) And we'll also be talking at mass about stewardship the 2nd and 3rd Sunday of the month as we start putting together the budget for next year.

Finally, we will be having our 1st parish adventure. We are going to Feil's in Randolph for Oktoberfest, Sunday Oct 30th. We'll be leaving St. Mark's at 4pm, or you can meet us at Feil's at 4:30. The cost is \$18.50 a person but scholarships are available if you can't afford the cost but wish to attend. See me for more information.


Annual Cookie Walk Time!!





St. Mark's Episcopal Church Vestry Meeting Minutes August 14th, 2022

Fr. Mike joined remotely Joann and Fred out of town

Meeting called to order: 10:58AM

Opening prayer by Jody

Fr. Mike followed with a devotion

Jr. Warden's Report

- 1. Waiting on final word regarding window, plans are in place for whenever it arrives, and everything is ready to go
- 2. New batteries for the urinal
- 3. New batteries in the smoke detectors
- 4. Exit lights replaced
- 5. Still no hot water for the women's bathroom
- 6. One toilet in the women's bathroom is going to have to be gutted and replaced, the float thing is practically non-existent

Correspondence

1. We got two thank you notes, one from Eagle's Wings for their activity fund for the residents

Sr. Warden's Report

1. Total \$828.36 for July brat stand, including brats sold at church the following Sunday

Rector's Report

- 1. **Update on window for Paul Lambert** waiting on it until we know how the big stained-glass window is going to work. Ongoing.
- 2. Ministries Grant haven't heard anything yet but submitted with a week to spare
- 3. **Online Store Update** By this Wednesday it should be up and running, don't have prices yet. Stuff is in creation currently
- 4. **Core Values Discussion** Talked with David G. on what the long view is for us as a church "Central Values" you come up with 3 central values (faith, family, sacrament??) Once established, every project after must be clear in how it ties into at least one of our central values

- 5. **Loaves and Fishes** Meal 4-5:30, held at First Lutheran, pick-up only, have run out of food. Maybe between 150-200 meals. Consider showing up to help serve meals. Help make our presence
- 6. **Senior Trip** Got lots of ideas from Gayle, but the first will be an October trip to Fiel's to Oktoberfest?? (other ideas: honey farm, wine testing, Fireside)
- 7. **Confirmation classes** every Sunday except for vestry Sunday, 10:30 noon, Sept. October.
- 8. Dates for Sept/Oct Vestry Sept. 18th, Oct. 23rd. Start planning vestry dates two months out
- 9. **Plaque for the Nativity** we have a substantial donor that's going to pay a large chunk of the cost, and then we'll ask the church members
- 10. **Chambers of Commerce Membership** Met with Tracy, chamber of commerce executive director, non-profit costs 186\$ every year. Get to be part of the network, everything the chamber has to offer, great way to network with other businesses, will let us put our stuff on the calendar but it must be at least 2 months ahead, will let you do bulk printing and bulk mailing. Fr. Mike thinks it's a good idea, everyone else unsure. Maybe do it after the first of the year
- 11. Logo for Polo Shirts and Sweatshirts Fr. Mike confirmed it, the basic St. Marks logo
- 12. Bid to Extend AC to Upper Levels actively getting bids on that
- 13. **Swing for the Prayer Garden** Mary Clark would like to buy, in honor of her family, commercial size swing for our "prayer garden" (the garden out front)
- 14. **Chaplain for Beaver Dam Police Department** met with police chief who would like Fr. Mike to be their police chaplain for beaver dam, they haven't had one in 2 years
- 15. **Multi-Cultural Potluck** made connections with a lot of people. it was at the re-store, last Sunday. so far, its only once a year. Lupita sponsored a lot of the food
- 16. **Some Kind of Good-Friday Service** used to have a service 12-3, "we" would like to redo that. will continue to discuss
- 17. Pastoral Care Report Fr. Mike has been very active all over the place. 20 hrs a week 12-5 St. Claire Hospital Baraboo, St. Mary's
- 18. **Position at St. Clare Hospital, Baraboo** Fr. Mike accepted part time, Monday-Thursday 12-5, free all day Friday, in beaver dam the whole day, won't be coming in until 5 on Wednesdays once he starts, will establish 3 hours of office time on another day
- 19. **Mitch McVick October 15th concert** Maison apparently supposed to make flyers for it. We'll pass the plate to the people that are there goal of \$800, rest from discretionary. originally going to be at swan park, but now will be held at St. Mark's as that's a better deal for us. punch and cookie after (falls under fellowship committee)
- 20. **Talent Fair** Linda brings up that with all of this, things are getting pretty busy. Fr. Mike says we can make it as big or small as we want. Kevin suggests soliciting talent to see what talent we even have to offer "maybe we reach out to the church first, see what people are comfortable signing up for / volunteering for". Fr. Mike suggests having people "sign up" and list whatever talent they'd be willing to offer on the "three-legged thing"
- 21. **Establish 2-person Prayer Teams** would be in addition to the blessings currently done, would be done during communion. people can volunteer
- 22. **Grief Group** in the fall, after the Wednesday service, 7-8, online and in person, a dozen or more people who have experienced loss in the last year alone. has 7 topics, do check in, have a task for the next week. goes for 7 weeks but if someone wants to do another 7 weeks they can

Security Surveillance - brought up because of the \$5,000 nativity scene. bring up to ken and david

Fr. Mike in charge of registering everyone, if people want to stay overnight that might be their responsibility - not sure, Fr. Mike has cut out so we cant ask. This (2 day) convention is in Milwaukee. Linda suggests we pay for room & mileage for delegates. We haven't budgeted for anything besides registration fees however. Will talk more about it at our next vestry meeting (\$500 for rectors travel expense, \$300 for convention 'other expenses')

Got a letter, forward to Jody by Joann, from the Haiti Partnership. No action needed, just informing us the diocese has entered into a partnership with them. Engage in their services for 5 months and if they still do a good job they might continue / do more

If the Eschweiler's (sp?) are involved, we maybe won't be as involved (minimum two people mentioned not wanting to work with them)

Sat, December 10th - cookie walk (get a committee together for this) **Scrip Update** - \$220.55


