

Blessings St. Mark's,

Fall is upon us. You can feel it in the air. I can't believe I have been with you a year already. I think this is one of my favorite summers of all time and I fall more in love with this parish each season.

I am focusing in my prayer on the gifts of the Winged Lion. The gospel on the 11th Sunday after Pentecost was from Luke 13:10-17 The woman bent over with affliction unable to stand straight up for 18 years. I feel like we are flying St. Mark's a bit rocky at times but flying. I feel like the choice is, "Do we focus on the ground or the Son?". We are trying new things and discerning God's call for us. It is exciting, terrifying, and exhausting but **HOLY**. The Holy Spirit is moving in Powerful ways. Hold on, St. Mark's, and we'll ride on the Back of the Lion to where our God is calling us together.



The Vestry is currently focusing on 3 central values: Faith, Family and Sacrament, but it'll be fine-tuned at the September meeting. When we have them finished each new initiative or proposal will need to connect to one of the central values. This is a way to make sure we don't get spread too thin and stay focused on being grounded.

Fall will bring several new and re-established opportunities to St. Mark's, including **Faith Formation**, **Confirmation**, **Reception and Re-Affirmation**. For those seeking confirmation, reception for another faith tradition into the Episcopal Church, re-affirmation for those who need to re-commit their faith, or members wishing to learn more about their faith. # Christmas Stocking Project





We had people who didn't work, but came and supported us by sharing a meal together and fellowship, but most of all we had the most workers I have ever seen!! My heart overflows with gratefulness as I reflect on how everyone showed up to work. How we had so many workers we could take shifts and the number of people we were able to teach what it takes to run a brat stand fundraiser.

I must admit though, there are still many things that most folks don't know about how we make this Brat Stand Fundraiser a success.

Did you know Bob Zamzow goes to Food Pride on January 1<sup>st</sup> at 7:00 am to stand in line for a lottery drawing of which date he wants to choose and then waits until he can choose a second date?

Did you know that there is advertising that needs to be done in advance?? Radio announcements, flyers, the sign out front of the church????

Did you know that Bob and Fred start the day at church at 7:30 am loading up the grills, nesco roasters and the tote of supplies?

Did you know that Bob and Linda Zamzow chop up onions (this time 3 cool whip bowls) so we can offer fresh onions and not pay Food Pride for the pre-chopped onions.

Did you know that at the end of the sale, we need to wash the nesco roasters, the utensils, the tablecloths, the hot pads, the pans, pack up extra sodas and waters, the condiments, and any leftover buns, burgers, brats and hot dogs?

Did you know that before the brat stand, the treasurer needs to make sure the coordinator has startup funds and the coordinator needs to get currency and coins in the amounts they think we will need?

Did you know that at the end of the day, monies need to be counted, recorded, and deposited of the funds raised and if there are extra sales on Sunday that money needs to be counted, recorded, and deposited with the record of the amount given to our financial administrative assistant?

So you can see that for our successful fundraisers there is lots to be done and your willingness to learn the before, during and after processes is a blessing.

Thanks to everyone who helped with our two very successful brats stand fundraisers this year.

# St. Mark's Episcopal Church Vestry Meeting Minutes July 17<sup>th</sup>, 2022

**Members Present:** ((couldn't remember everyone's names))

Called to Order 10:42 AM
Opened with prayer by Fr. Mike

Linda moves to accept June's minutes, seconded by Linda All say I

Motion to move Jr. Warden's report before Treasurer's report, seconded by Christine All say I

#### Jr. Warden's Report

- 1. Trimmed all the bushes outside
- 2. Will be cutting / trimming lilac bushes so we should have flower next year
- 3. Eaves troughs cleaned
- 4. Walk behind lawn mower bit the dust, took it home so he could work on it with his grandson
- 5. Jody donated her walk-behind lawn mower
- 6. Starting of stained-glass project discussed, Fr. Mike suggested end of month early August. 7. Early August agreed upon, will work with Ken on a good day to start
- 8. Linda brought up hot water in the ladies bathroom as it was on the agenda, that's still on the list to be done
- 9. Parking lot lines need to be re-drawn, possibly needs to be re-sealed. Will get somebody to put down a heated sealant, better than the storebought stuff you do yourself
- 10. Fr. Mike & Betsy are still in conversation over the stained-glass window, wants to see the one being planned because she wants to do one for Paul (??) but doesn't want them to clash
- 11. Kevin asks how long we'd keep a window like that up, like if the building changed, what we do with gifts to the church. "Gifts to the church are gifts to the church, so we treat it with sensitivity, but nobody gets to hold us hostage" Fr. Mike. We don't throw out gifts but where we put them, how we use them is up to us (paraphrasing) example:: a plant. if it dies/needs to be dug up:: Replace it as close as you can, bless it for whoever it was for, or figure out who the family is and ask if they care. Just do due diligence
- 12. We should really keep a list of donations / 'in memory of's
- "When you're on the roof.. who knows you're on the roof?" a concerned Kevin asking an excellent question.

565 - 150.15\$ so far for bulletin inserts; put in budget for next year

770 - nothing to worry about, a stock thing that goes up and down as stock things do

Sent all stuff for audit to Carolin, have not heard back yet

**Correspondence** - got a check from Texas Roadhouse 7.75\$

#### **Old Business**

**Scrip Update::** \$122.58


