A LETTER TO THE SEVEN CHURCHES

We're trying something new this semester in several of our Life Groups by offering a sermon-based Life Group study.

Starting February 1st, our church will begin a new Sunday sermon series titled **Revelation: A Letter to the Seven Churches**. These powerful letters from Jesus speak directly to the church—calling us to faithfulness, repentance, endurance, and a deeper love for Him.

To help our church family grow together around this series, we're offering a 7-week Life Group study that aligns with each week's sermon.

## How It Works

Each week after the Sunday message, a study guide will be released on the Branch Church app & website. It will include:

- A brief summary of the sermon's key themes
- Thought-provoking discussion questions
- Application prompts to help connect God's Word to everyday life

Your Life Group will have the option to follow along with this study as you meet during the week. This allows all of us to stay centered on the same Scriptures and spiritual focus, while still experiencing them in the unique context of each group.

If someone misses a Sunday service, they can easily watch the sermon on the Branch Church app or website so they can still fully participate in the Life Group discussion. Some groups may even choose to watch part of the sermon together before diving into the questions.

## Where to Find the Guides

Each week's study guide will be available on the Branch Church app and website, attached to that week's sermon. You can view it digitally or print it—whatever works best for your group. We believe God uses Life Groups to do some of His deepest work in us through honest conversations, prayer, encouragement, and shared growth. As we walk through Revelation together this semester, our prayer is that Jesus' words to the churches will shape us into a church that is faithful, alive, and devoted to Him.

We're so grateful for every person who opens their home, leads a group, shows up, and leans in. Let's expect God to do something powerful in us this semester.
