Come, then—leave your nets, your fears, your certainties.

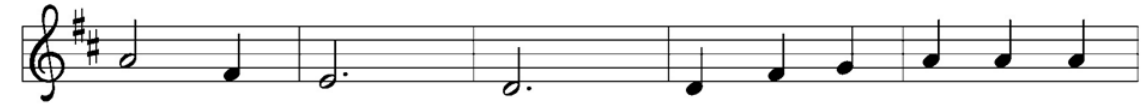


