This year our cover theme will be Florida wildlife This month is the Sandhill Crane

Sandhill cranes (Grus canadensis) are long-legged, long-necked, gray, heron-like birds with a patch of bald, red skin on top of their head. Cranes fly with necks outstretched like geese, whereas herons fly with necks tucked in on their backs. For positive identification, look for reddish skin on top of the crane's head.

The Florida sandhill crane can reach a height of 47.2 inches (120 centimeters) with a wingspan around 78.7 inches (200 centimeters) (Nesbitt 1996). This species is gray with a long neck and legs, and a bald spot of red skin on the top of its head. The sandhill crane is unique in flight as it can be seen flying with its neck stretched out completely.

Florida sandhill cranes inhabit freshwater marshes, prairies, and pastures. They occur throughout peninsular Florida north to the Okefenokee Swamp in southern Georgia; however, they are less common at the northernmost and southernmost portions of this range. Florida's Kissimmee and Desoto prairie regions are home to the state's most abundant populations,

Open hands



Liturgical scholar Balthasar Fischer (1912-2001) shared an "a-ha" realization about the significance of praying with open, outstretched hands, an ancient practice. The opposite gesture, a closed fist, is used to threaten others or even inflict violence. We also grasp things in closed fists, refusing to let go, to share, to hold gently or loosely.

When we pray with open hands, Fischer explained, we're saying before God that we renounce "all highhandedness, all pride in [our] own sufficiency, all violence." We hold up our empty hands to God, saying, "I have nothing that I have not received from you, nothing that you have not placed in my empty hands. Therefore I do not keep a frantic hold on anything you have given me; therefore, too, I desire not to strike and hurt but only to give and to spread happiness and joy."

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In his letter to the Galatians, Paul shares a list of nine characteristics that come to fruition in the lives of Christians when they are full of the Spirit of God. He focuses on how God's Spirit gives us the power to serve others in love and suggests that we must allow the Holy Spirit to lead us. Please note that in verses 22-23 patience is one of these virtues.

"But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, <u>patience</u>, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. Against such things there is no law."

It has been almost 18 months since Hurricane Ian crashed ashore at Ft. Myers Beach and ravished our little piece of paradise. During this time, we have had to exhibit an abundance of patience. But God is good all the time and I write to you with some exciting updates regarding the progress at St. Peter.

- With the assistance of Keys Claims Consultants, Council settled with Citizen's Insurance to close the
 wind claim. This resulted in an additional \$94,100 for St. Peter above the original settlement offer of
 \$182,819.82 which is an approximate 51% larger settlement after fees. The check has been received
 and deposited into our account.
- A contract has been executed with Valco Contacting, LLC, a general contractor, to begin the process of the repair and rebuilding. The repair of the flooring in the sanctuary has already begun and plumbers will start by the end of the week.

- The cross from Lua Hall was salvaged during demolition and will be installed at the top of the sanctuary building. Engineering details have been completed and the structural framing and stainless brackets are being purchased and fabricated. We are hoping that the cross will be a beacon of hope from its new location in a short two weeks.
- A contract with GSD Construction Services, LLC has been signed for a new metal roof. Materials are being ordered and the tear off and dry-in should be started within two weeks.
- An electrical permit should be issued any day and power will soon be restored to the building.
- A completed set of construction/permit drawings for the renovations to the St. Peters Lutheran
 Sanctuary have been finished. This includes plumbing and electrical drawings for updating the
 restrooms for ADA compliance, the engineering for the cross, new stairways and ramps to access the
 building, a new lift for wheelchair accessibility and a redesigned entranceway to replace the old
 breezeway.
- Council has voted to purchase a new 12x16 shed to replace the one lost. This will allow the storage of furniture, materials, etc. during construction and into the future.
- We continue with the assistance of Pastor Stehr to successfully hold regular Sunday service under the tent. This has been well received and attended with an average weekly attendance of over 75 people.

We understand that exhibiting patience can be difficult. Thank you for your patience and for the trust you have placed in the hands of the council. Let's continue to celebrate all the things God has bestowed on St. Peter and pray for the future of St. Peter and Fort Myers Beach.

Mutual Ministry: Mark has been our liaison to this committee but because of his involvement with property and maintenance he would like someone else to resume this committee. Doug will ask Courtney if she would be willing to be the liaison.

Social Ministry: WELCA collected over 60 cans of soup on Super Bowl Sunday to be brought to the Baptist church for distribution to the needy.

Old Business:

Paper work is almost finished to turn in for permits.

Demolition of Lau Hall is complete at a cost of \$51,201 by PAWS.

Work Day has been rescheduled for February 24, 2024 at 9:00 a.m.

Keys Claims Update: Citizens has offered \$100,000 more on our insurance claim but we will continue to hold off for more money.

Worship: Since it is difficult to hear the music by the keyboardist we will look into obtaining a small speaker by the keyboard to help. Comic has been rescheduled for Feb. 25 because of predicted rain.

Shed quotes: Jim Look will continue to look into obtaining a shed for storage so that we do not have to keep paying rent on the pod.

New Business:

Recap of Feb 10 meeting with Pastor El-Yateem and representatives for Chapel-By-the-Sea: We felt that from our perspective the meeting was beneficial in order to express our feelings about a joint venture. Chapel has not made any decisions yet and will be meeting on Feb. 25 to get input from Chapel members. We will meet again on March 12 at 4:30 to get their input on going forward. Malana Scrubbs is their liaison.

Discussion ensued about moving forward with the rebuild of St. Peter. Estimated costs were looked at and because we are within the FEMA guidelines we will proceed with the projects as soon as the permits are issued.

A motion was made by Doug and seconded by Jana to issue a 25% deposit of \$38,755 to Valco construction. Motion passed.

A motion was made by Doug and seconded by Jana to authorize GSD Roofing for a new metal roof not to exceed \$100,000.. Motion passed.

A motion was made by Jim and seconded by Arlene to authorize Haines for new HVAC system not to exceed \$52,000. Motion passed.

Pastor will check with Pastor El-Yateem to see if the synod can help us with any of the expenses.

A motion was made by Arlene and seconded by Jana to adjourn the meeting at 7:55pm. Motion passed.

We closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Our next scheduled meeting will be March 21, 2024 at Arlene's house.
