



2026 Faith Promise Giving To Missions: While Westminster's General Fund is used to support missions giving to campus ministry and church planting, the rest of our missions' program is funded by your Faith Promise giving. Faith Promise is trusting God as you give, above and beyond your regular tithes, toward the ministry of our missionaries in furthering the spread of the Gospel across the globe. Faith Promise is sacrificial giving. It is giving through an abundance of joy and wealth of generosity according to your means and beyond your means (II Corinthians 8:2–3). Such “freewill” offerings are mentioned frequently in the Bible. One such place is Psalm 54:6-7. There David writes, “With a freewill offering I will sacrifice to you; I will give thanks to your name, O LORD, for it is good. For he has delivered me from every trouble, and my eye has looked in triumph on my enemies.” Faith Promise giving will foster a more direct and personal connection between you and our missionaries as you take an integral part in their ministry. While we are thankful for those who give and do not pledge out of conviction, letting us know of your intent helps us make missions budgeting decisions more accurately. Our goal this year is \$200,000.

PCA CDM Women's Love Gift: Each year, the PCA's Committee on Discipleship Ministries collects a special offering from churches to support the wives of elders by providing counseling, training, and encouragement so they can be equipped as they care for their church and their spouse. Westminster will be collecting this offering during the evening service on Nov. 30. Please prayerfully consider giving to this Love Gift and pray that these gifts would be used to encourage our elders' wives and, ultimately, to glorify the Lord.
