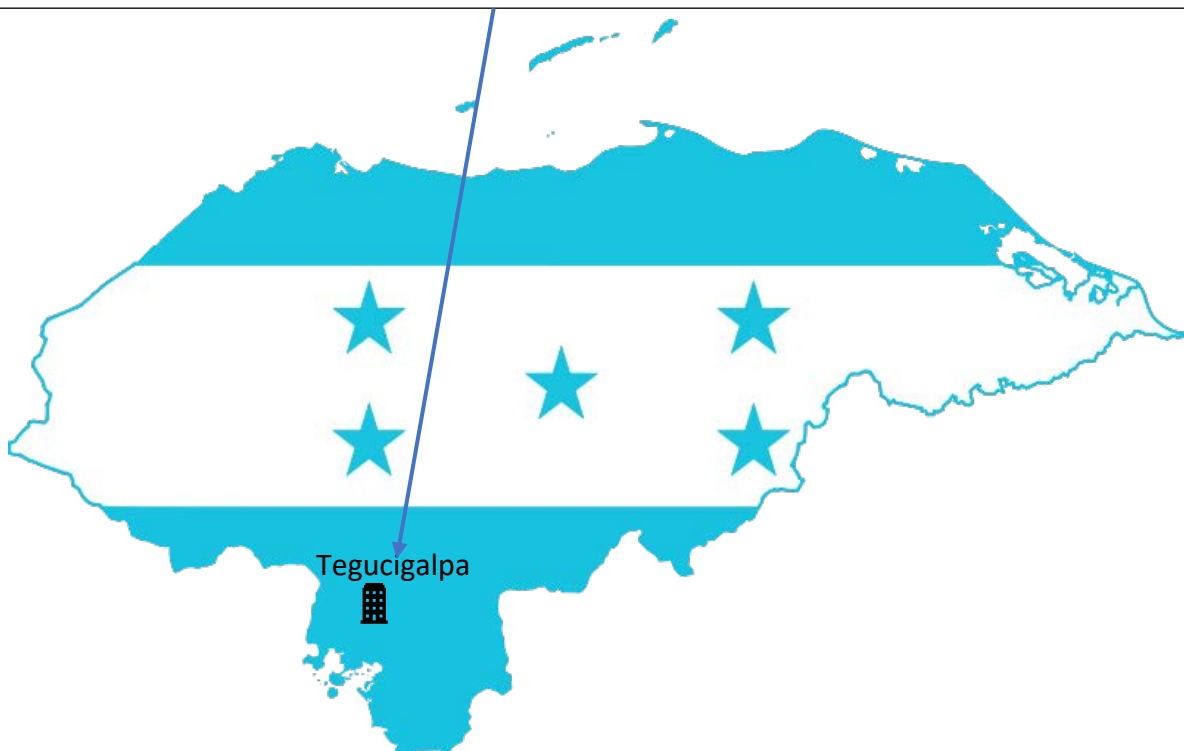

THE NEED

Honduras is a beautiful country full of a vibrant and passionate people. However, though Christianity has been an influence in Honduras for a long time, the gospel message of grace has not been missing. The country is overwhelmed with churches preaching works and prosperity, and people are in need of hearing the gospel of grace alone, through faith alone, in Christ alone. One particular area of need is Fundación Hogar Los Ángeles, a special needs ministry located just outside the city of Tegucigalpa. It is home to approximately 70 residents with varying levels of mental and physical disabilities and is supported by a staff of around 30 caregivers.

THE MINISTRY

MTW's team in Tegucigalpa is serving alongside Hondurans to establish and grow a national Presbyterian denomination to spread the Reformed message of grace throughout the country. The primary ministry focus in Tegucigalpa is church planting. The first church plant, Iglesia Presbiteriana Gracia Soberana, has grown by the Lord's grace and mercy, and preparations are being made to plant more churches around the perimeter of the city. As the Lord directs, more churches will be planted throughout Honduras to bring grace, help to the church as we serve alongside its members and support their ministry partners. We will be serving alongside WPV supported missionaries Adam and Michelle Cain.



THE MISSIONS TRIP EXPERIENCE

- **Local ministry:** Participate in ministry alongside the church plant and serve our local partners – especially with Fundación Hogar Los Ángeles. Ministry there will include:
 - **General property maintenance:** Hogar Los Ángeles is a large property with ongoing maintenance needs. Assisting with upkeep is a great encouragement to both the staff and residents. There will also likely be a specific project identified that will directly benefit the home.
 - **Craft ministry:** Part of each day will be spent engaging residents in simple craft activities. This provides residents with a change of routine and meaningful interaction, while also giving the house moms (tías) some rest or the opportunity to participate alongside the residents if they choose.
- **Corporate worship:** Worship with Iglesia Presbiteriana Gracia Soberana.
- **Vision and teaching:** Learn about the need for Reformed church planting in Honduras and Latin America and hear about the broader vision for ministry in the region.



- **Cultural experience:** Experience Honduran culture and history through food and planned outings. The majority of meals will feature traditional Honduran cuisine.

COST

The cost for the trip will be \$1000 plus airfare (approx. \$1000). In addition to these two items you may/will need to pay for 3-4 meals while traveling.

MINIMUM AND MAXIMUM PARTICIPATION

- A minimum of 10 and a maximum of 20 people.
- The trip is first come, first served!

FAQ

- Who can attend? Approved persons aged 16 and up. Younger children may attend with a parent if they can do the work.
- Do I need to be vaccinated against COVID 19 to travel to Honduras? No.
- How many meetings before and after the trip should I expect? There will be three to four meetings before the trip and another two to three after the trip.
- Where will we stay? In a local home being rented for the expressed purpose of housing teams.
- Is Honduras safe to travel to? As of January 5, 2024, the U.S. Department of State puts Honduras at a level 3 – “Reconsider Travel.” It lists certain areas to avoid, and we avoid those areas! However, please remember that all travel has its risks!
- How will we travel from place to place? We do not take public transportation. The MTW missionaries rent vehicles which are driven by trusted individuals.
- How long does it take to get to Tegucigalpa from the states? Think in terms of 12+ hours from the time you leave your home until the time you get to the airport in Tegucigalpa!
- What about a packing list? Packing details, a specific trip schedule and more will be available at the first team meeting.
- Do I need any shots to participate? Yes. You must have had a tetanus booster within the last ten years. Please see the CDC.GOV website for recommended shots. Which shots you choose to get is a personal decision.
- What resources will we have to pay for the trip? The Westminster Huntsville Missions Team will contribute up to 50% of the trip cost. The exact amount is dependent on how much money is available in the Short-Term Missions Fund and the number of participants going on trips. You will need to raise the rest through fundraising letters, odd jobs, emptying your piggy bank (or your parents’ piggy bank), etc.
- What if I have further questions about this trip? Contact Pastor Cantrell, who will be leading the trip.
