
Remember Your Church This Summer!

Hike for the Homeless -Tuesday, August 19th 5 - 8 pm

The **22nd Annual** *Hike for the Homeless* benefits *Family Promise of the Chippewa Valley Inc,* which owns and operates the Beacon House Shelter in Eau Claire. They provide homeless families with temporary shelter and work with them to find permanent homes and become financially independent. Last year 5,743 nights of shelter and 9,286 meals were provided to 36 families with 84 children in our community. Our annual event helps provide us with the financial resources to provide these services. The *Hike for the Homeless* will be held at River Prairie Park in Altoona, WI. Participants will walk all or part of the 2.8-mile course. The hike is stroller, wheelchair, and pet friendly.

Wow, it's August! I'm not quite sure how this month has already arrived, but Summer always flies by, doesn't it? I hope you've each been finding moments of peace, joy, and love in this Summer season. I've been spending much time in the healing waters of the lakes and rivers! God's creation is sure is great.

This month we have a few remaining Summer events, and we're getting prepared for Fall! Coming up this month we have a young adult meet up at Phoenix



Park on the 15th, our final Educational Hour on Spiritual Practices on August 24th, along with congregation appreciation treats from the staff to you! On the 20th, 9th graders are having a session to decorate their Confirmation stolls at 3:00pm, and at 4:00pm we have an input session for all highschoolers to help design the best high school programming. On Thursday the 28th we have our final single Summer Stretch day, and you may still join us! On August 31st we'll have our JAM teacher training following Worship.

This month, I invite all families to register for Fall programming! I ask all families to have an updated participant information form on file each year. There will be a registration table in the gathering space throughout the month of August. <u>You may also register here today!</u> Our programming will look very similar to previous years, but here is an updated overview:

Here are the descriptions of our programs:

JAM (Jesus And Me) - Our children's education classes are held each week for students from Pre K - 5th grade. Families can choose to have

children attend Sunday morning or Wednesday evening or both! Each week we dive into a key bible story, and use games, craft, and drama to deepen our understanding.

Joyful Noise - Joyful Noise is our children's choir. We practice each Sunday after worship and before JAM, we share our music in worship six times a year! All Sunday JAM students are automatically apart of Joyful Noise. All children and youth are invited to join our Christmas Program.

Youth After School Hours - Starting at 3:00pm on Wednesday's the youth room is open for 6th - 12th graders to join us for fellowship and activities after school. If you go to Northstar Middle School, or North High you may walk on over when school is out, if you have school farther away you are invited to be dropped off whenever works! There are snacks, a homework help space, a project in crafty corner, and games available to have some chill time with your fellow youth.

Youth Group - At 4:30pm on Wednesdays we begin our official youth group activity! This activity varies weekly and rotates between service projects, crafts, cooking, active games, and field trips. Youth have a voice and say in planning what activities we schedule! Youth between 6th and 12th grade are encouraged to attend!

Soup & Song - 5:15pm (*first Wednesday of the month only*) Soup and Song is an intergenerational interactive casual worship and meal on the first Wednesday of the month October - April. We gather at 5:15 in Olson Hall in a circle for a casual worship and themed activity followed by a yummy dinner! Soup and song is for all ages, and the whole congregation is invited to participate! Our 2025-2026 theme will be peace.

Confirmation - Youth seeking Confirmation are invited to attend Confirmation classes from 6:00pm-7:00pm on Wednesday evenings. Class begins with large group education led by Grace followed by small group discussion time we end each day with music and closing prayer. The course rotates on a three year basis ensuring each Confirmation student learns the Old Testament, New Testament, Ten Commandments, and Luther's Small Catechism. This year our learning focus is the Old Testament.

High School Bible Study & ROSE Program - New this year, we are offering a High School bible study and ROSE program to run on Wednesday evenings from 7:00 - 8:00pm. This interactive and exploratory hour will allow our older youth to continue nurturing their faith and diving deeper into what scripture and faith means to them as they transition to adulthood. We'll also use this time to plan service projects, and begin preparations for the 2026 Tri-Synod High School Youth Gathering and 2027 ELCA Youth Gathering.

As we prepare to start up this educational programming year, I am now recruiting JAM teachers, mentors for eighth graders, confirmation small group leaders, and a handful of adults to rotate and help supervise on Wednesday evenings once a month. Please email me or reach out if you are interested in these volunteer opportunities! Thank you for your consideration.

I invite all families to register children and youth for Fall during the month of August by filling out the 2025-2026 Participant Information Form. This form needs to be filled out per family to ensure we have your updated information! Knowing which programs you plan to attend helps us prepare and order the correct amount of resources. <u>You may register here today!</u>


