Hello Hope Family!

It's been a joy to see you so far this Fall season. I hope this finds you well, and that you're enjoying the return of crisp air, cozy sweaters, and turning leaves. Thank you all for your presence in our special Hope community.

This month we continue our normally scheduled youth and family ministries including JAM, Joyful Noise, After School Hours, Youth Group, Confirmation, and High School Bible Study. We also have a few special events including Soup & Song, Mentorship Brunch, Confirmation Rehearsal, and Trunk or Treat!

You are invited and encouraged to join us on October 1st at 5:15pm in Olson Hall for our return to Soup & Song! This year we will be engaging in songs, prayers, and activities around our theme of *Peace*. Soup and Song begins with a casual "workshop worship", and then we all share a meal together! I'm looking for a few helpers to clean up this month, let me know if you're free! Families of all ages, the whole Hope congregation, and members of community are welcome for Soup & Song!

On the last day of month we invite you to join us for our 5th annual Trunk or Treat! Join us on Halloween from 4:30-5:30pm for this fun event! This event has morphed into a sort-of kick off for neighborhood trick-or-treating, and all are welcome to stop by! We anticipate a few hundred kiddos and their families to be walking through. There are a few ways to join in and help! If you'd like to donate candy you may drop it off in the front office, or sign up to decorate your trunk, or help out with the event in the gathering space. We'd love to get a good number of trunks this year, so consider joining us! Thanks in advance for your help to make our event *spook-tackular!!!*

On Sunday, October 5th we'll host our mentorship brunch for 8th graders seeking confirmation and their mentors. Thank you to all who have volunteered to support our future confirmands in this way. This month in Confirmation class we'll continue learning about the New Testament, and in JAM, we'll dive into the stories of Noah's Ark, and the Martin Luther and the Reformation. High School bible study has so far studied on the themes of trust and bravery. This month, we're continuing to explore themes of embodying our faith.

On Sunday October 26th we have our Confirmation Rehearsal Brunch. All students getting confirmed this year, their parents, and mentors are invited to join us in the fireside room. You'll get fitted with robes, have your picture taken, share about your mentorship year and rehearse for confirmation!

Last year in this newsletter, I shared an Ojibwe poem of peace. Reading it over again as I write this year's newsletter, I find it more poignant than ever, and I'd like to share once more. According to native-lands.ca, here at Hope Lutheran we gather and worship on the ancestral lands of the Omaeqnomenew-ahkew (Menominee), and the Očhéthi Šakówin (Sioux), and quite near to Anishinabewaki (Ojibwe) peoples. As I spoke of in my sermon this past July, we the church, we the people, must come to terms with the terrible sins perpetuated at the hands of colonialism which continues today in our systems of capitalism. We together must learn how to reunite in love for each other, love for creation, and love for ourselves. We can each orient our compass to love in the choices we make, words we use, and actions we perpetuate each day. May we follow the example of Jesus and go forth in true peace of word and deed. May we heed indigenous wisdom, deeply listen, and learn and evolve together to create a better, more peaceful tomorrow. Blessings to you this day.

Once again, here is the poem of peace written by Margarte Noodin.

Nana'isanishinaam / Bring Us Peace

Gizhawenimimin Gichidibenjiged We are blessed by you Lord ezhi-aanikoobidooyan gakina gegoo. you who connects all being. Gizhawenimimin Giizis We are blessed by you Sun ezhi-mashkawizi'iyaang. you give us light and strength. Gizhawenimimin Dibiki-giizis We are blessed by you Moon gikinoo'amawiyaang zaagaasidiyaang. you teach us the importance of reflection. Gizhawenimimin Mashkiig We are blessed by you Land and Water ezhi-ditibiziyan wenji-bimaadiziyaang. your circulation supports our living. Apii zhawenimiyaang, zhawenimangidwaa. As we are blessed, we bless others. Apii zaagi'iyaang, zaagi'angidwaa. As we are loved, we love others. Apii noojimo'iyaang, noojimo'angidwaa. As we are healed, we heal others. Apii inawenimigooyan, inawenindiyaang. As we are related to you, we are related to one another. Naadamawishinaam daga noongom Help us all now Nagamotawishinaam daga noongom Sing to us all now

As presiding bishop of this church, I want to address yesterday's shooting in Utah. Charlie Kirk, known by millions for his views and videos supporting right-wing ideas, died by another senseless act of political violence. He was exercising his First Amendment right of free speech when he was shot and killed. This continues a long streak of political violence that shows no sign of subsiding. We've witnessed an attack on the husband of former House Speaker Nancy Pelosi, two attempts to assassinate President Donald Trump during last year's campaign, the murder of two Minnesota state lawmakers, an arson attack on the home of Pennsylvania's governor, a plot to kidnap Michigan's governor, and too many more.

As I wrote last year, after the attempt on President Trump's life in Butler, Pa., "God calls this church to say a definitive 'no' to political violence now and in the future. Political violence has a long history but no place in democracy. This church belongs to God, and our unity in Christ is a grace-filled and healing gift in a fractured society."


This church teaches that disagreement is healthy and can lead to greater understanding and cooperation. But we have lost that sense of respectful debate and have degenerated into a society that treats differing opinions as personal attacks, erasing the humanity of some and abandoning the gospel of Jesus Christ. We must recommit ourselves to reflecting what Christ taught us through acts of forgiveness, healing and new life. I continue to hold that "God's resolve for peace in human communities is unshakable."

In this moment, I urge all of us in this church to embrace God's call, to hear and embody the good news of Jesus Christ and to fulfill our roles as peacemakers through active civic engagement.
