There are a couple of ways you could help:

- Purchase gift cards to Woodman's or Walmart and mail or bring them to the World Relief office (221 W Madison St Suite 107, Eau Claire, WI 54703).
- Share this need with others in your sphere of influence. This could include family, friends, churches, or other organizations you are part of.
- Consider being part of a team to develop a workshop to help newcomers learn how to save money on groceries and other items.
