#### Welcome to our 2024 Lenten Devotional Guide!

We want to invite you to take a prayerful journey with us through the season of Lent and we have prepared this resource as a tool to help guide you.

Depending on your past church experiences, you may be unfamiliar with Lent.

## What is Lent?

Lent is a season of personal repentance, prayer and fasting during the 6 1/2 weeks that lead up to Easter, beginning on Ash Wednesday. The observation of Lent likely dates back to apostolic times but was formalized at the Council of Nicea in 325 AD.

During these weeks of personal preparation, we want to invite you to take up the daily practice of prayerfully reading the scriptures and fasting once/a week.

# What is fasting?

Fasting is abstaining from something to intentionally focus on another thing.

In the Christian tradition, that has generally been practiced by abstaining from food to focus on connecting with Jesus through worship, prayer, and reading scripture.

In Matthew 6 (what we know as the Sermon on the Mount), Jesus is speaking to His followers and says these three practices will mark people connected to His Kingdom.

# <sup>16</sup> "And when you fast,

don't make it obvious, as the hypocrites do, for they try to look miserable and disheveled so people will admire them for their fasting.

I tell you the truth, that is the only reward they will ever get.

<sup>17</sup> But when you fast, comb your hair [d] and wash your face.

<sup>18</sup> Then no one will notice that you are fasting, except your Father, who knows what you do in private.

And your Father, who sees everything, will reward you.

# Did you see that?

Jesus says His people are to be a generous people who pray and fast. Those spiritual practices are not unique.

What makes these practices unique for followers of Jesus is the motivation out of which they are carried out. We pray and fast, not for the applause of others, but out of a love for and desire to connect with our audience of One: your heavenly Father.

To the extent that we do these three things with this God-directed heart motivation, here is the promise: your Father, who sees everything, will reward you.

Jesus' words here from the Sermon on the Mount align with this statement from the author of Hebrews:

<sup>6</sup> And it is impossible to please God without faith. Anyone who wants to come to him must believe that God exists and that he rewards those who sincerely seek him.

God is not playing hide and seek with us. He is inviting us to meet with Him and He wants to bless you!

During the season of Lent, we are inviting you to fast with us for breakfast and lunch one day a week to spend focus time in worship, prayer, and reading the scriptures.

If your health does not allow you to fast, you are welcome to fast from certain foods, from social media, from tv, etc ... Again, the heart behind this is that we turn our appetites and attention away from one thing and turn them toward Jesus.

The day of the week you choose to fast is up to you. You know your schedule best, but we encourage you to schedule the day because we all know what happens if priorities don't land on our calendars.

# How can I prayerfully read the scriptures?

Some evenings when I am home, I will suddenly realize my wife is asking me, "Did you hear what I just said?"

I'm sure you've never heard that before!

As I pull myself from watching TV, I suddenly realize my wife, Stephanie, has been talking to me but I was not listening.

Now there are two potential answers to her question.

One is to pretend I heard and try to figure out what we are talking about as we continue the conversation or just fess up and say "No" I did not.

I find it usually goes better if I do the latter!

Too often, God is trying to speak into our lives but we are so zoned into the busyness of life we do not hear his voice.

In the Old Testament, the boy Samuel was trying to discern God's voice. His mentor Eli said, go sit and pray, "Speak Lord for your servant is listening."

During this season of Lent we are asking you to make space and time to open the Scriptures, listen for God's voice, and pray the prayer of Samuel, "Speak Lord, your servant is listening."

In this resource, you will find Scriptures for each day of Lent. We invite you to read them and take the time to **HEAR** God's voice by applying this acronym to each passage.

**H** <u>Highlight</u> Highlight what speaks to you in the verse.

**E** Explain Write in your own words what this verse means to you.

A <u>Apply</u> Write down write down how this scripture might apply to your life.

R <u>Respond</u> Write down one action that you might take because of what you

have read.

We invite you during this journey of Lent to join us each day by reading the following verses and applying the H.E.A.R. model. You may want to start a daily journal to write out the Scripture references and your responses applying the H.E.A.R. model. In doing so we pray that together we will hear from God and grow.

#### March 29th

#### March 31<sup>st</sup> He is Risen!

24 On the first day of the week, very early in the morning, the women took the spices they had prepared and went to the tomb. While they were wondering about this, suddenly two men in clothes that gleamed like lightning stood beside them. In their fright the women bowed down with their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here; he has risen! – Luke 24:1-6
