### Joyful Worship of Christ Our King

- 7 new children sponsored through Children of the Nations
- Added new leaders to our already fantastic group of SeasideYouth leaders
- 4 Seasiders chipped in to gift a new guitar to one of our youth who couldn't afford it
- · Hosted 300+ folks from our neighborhood for our annual Trunk or Treat Halloween Party
- Hundreds of meals prepped and served (individuals/ families via the Meal Train and Community Groups for SeasideYouth)
- Seasiders volunteered for, worked with, and/or donated to Thrive Kitsap, Trillium Women's Center, Youth for Christ, Young Life, Children of the Nations, Olive Crest, Salvation Army, Miracle Ranch, Scarlet Road, Bremerton Foodline, and others

Made the following improvements/ changes in 2024: -Switched insurance companies to Brotherhood Mutual (lower cost, better coverage)

- -Moved payroll processing to Ministry Works (lower cost, payroll tailored to churches)
- -Separated our Ministry House income/ expenses from our church giving/ expenses.
- -Improved accounting and purchasing processes for accountability and transparency
- -Began standardizing benefits and pay for church staff


