



### Living Last Supper Casting Call

3500 years ago, the Jewish people were in bondage to the Egyptians. At the climax of God's struggle with Pharoah to let the Jewish people go, He had Moses alert the Egyptians and Jews that while nine plagues hadn't softened Pharaoh's heart, a tenth and final plague was coming - the death of the firstborn. The people were instructed that if they were obedient to God's command to mark the doorposts of their house with the blood of a sacrificed lamb, the Angel of Death would pass over their houses, and they would be spared by God from the tenth plague. This act of obedience, repentance, and sacrifice - marked by the blood of a perfect lamb - saved many from death.

1500 years later, Jesus was commemorating this event with the twelve disciples at the Passover Feast. It would be the last time that he would be with all of his disciples this side of the tomb. At this supper, Jesus established a new covenant with those that would follow him. He took Matzo bread - striped and pierced - and offered it to his disciples as his body. He poured the wine for his disciples as a symbol for how his blood would be poured out for the forgiveness of sins only hours later. When we in obedience and repentance participate in the Lord's Supper, acknowledging the sacrifice that Jesus - The Lamb of God - made on our behalf, we honor the covenant He made that saves us from spiritual death.

The Living Last Supper is a piece that incorporates monologues written from the perspectives of Jesus' twelve disciples along with choral anthems that encourage us to reflect upon this incredible moment in history. It is my hope that this piece will move us all to grow in relationship to Jesus - the one who promises to wipe our sins away, heal our brokenness, dry our tears, and give us new life. I hope you'll join us and invite others to join us on Maundy Thursday, March 28, 2024 at 7:00 pm

### HAVE A HEART FOR HAITI: LACROIX NEW TESTAMENT MISSION UPDATE OF 2.1.24



### We begin 2024 with hope for peace for Haitian families.

You are part of that hope as supporters of the LaCroix New Testament Mission
The LaCroix New Testament Mission strives to create a safe environment for the students,
teachers and congregation members. Teachers are brought to school on the mission bus so that
they do not have to navigate public transportation. Classes are held daily Monday through Friday,
and serve a hot lunch to the children each day.

The meals are prepared by women from the community who treat the children with love and respect and make sure they each have enough food to sustain them. Many families depend on the school lunch program to keep their families fed.

Children also participate in Bible Study and music in chapel time to help them stay connected to God. They are also taught a social gospel helping them to feel part of a community greater than themselves. The mission school is a haven for love and peace for the people of the seven communities served by the mission.

### **BUT....**

It has again been a tough year for people living in Haiti. Many young people who could have been contributors to the community have gone to other countries seeking a safer environment. This brings challenges for them that are not realized until they arrive in their new location. It is a difficult situation for the people who stay in Haiti and no longer feel safe in their homeland.

The Mission seems to have the Hand of God over it. The staff is willing to serve its people and although some have gone seeking a better life, others choose to remain and make life better for the children and families of the community.



### HAVE A HEART FOR HAITI: LACROIX NEW TESTAMENT MISSION UPDATE CONTINUED...



Dearest friends and esteemed supporters of the LaCroix ministry, Greetings in the glorious name of the Son of God, the almighty Lord Jesus Christ.

#### THERE IS NO FUNCTIONAL GOVERNMENT IN HAITI

The population of Haiti is tired of living this kind of life. They live in fear and cannot go to their normal activities like going to the market etc. When they go out, they only know when they return home if they will come home safe. They cannot sleep peacefully at night for fear of getting kidnapped. For more than three years now Haitians are experiencing a famine. It is still doing its course. The people in Lacroix and its vicinity would not know what to do if it was not for the food that the mission provides for them every month with the financial aid, they received from you.

#### NO SCHOOL AT THE MISSION COMPOUND - FOOD DISTRIBUTION

School was back in session in January. Now, due to political instability, strike for two weeks school has been closed. The satellite schools of the mission are functioning because they are inside the villages and not out as the school in Lacroix. In Lacroix school children come in civil clothes to receive food and money that their sponsors sent for them. As you can see in the attached photos regarding the food distribution, this is a new strategy we use to divide people into smaller groups and they come at different times of the day. We do this to keep the safety within our walls. With large crowds it is very difficult to have full control. We pray to God for a good and safe climate so that children at the mission can return to school safely. So, last week, we managed to give food to 300 families. This week we are going to continue to serve more villages. Thank you very much for always supporting this ministry in the work that God has given us to do. You won't be able to imagine how many people you help through the New Testament Mission. Thank you for your big heart! May God continue to shower his grace and blessings on you.
