In John 4 we find the very famous story of Jesus meeting a Samaritan woman (someone that would typically be avoided by someone with Jesus' earthly background) at a well. At that well, Jesus is thirsty from his journey and his ministry and he asks the woman to give him a drink. Now the woman knows that someone like Jesus and a Samaritan woman rarely ever mix so she's blown away by his request. YOU a Jew asking ME a Samaritan woman for a drink? That's crazy talk! The rest of the conversation though reveals that what Jesus has in mind is much more than water. He says to her "if you drink this water, guess what? You just get thirsty again. You'll be right back to this well someday, and probably someday soon." And this is where Jesus shares the true purpose of this whole conversation. "Whoever drinks of the water I give them will never be thirsty again." The woman's barriers are removed and her response is simple, "give me this water."

Operation Christmas Child Update

Our bus loaded with 40 volunteers left Washington on December 5 and traveled to the Samaritan's Purse Mid-Atlantic Ministry Center in Baltimore. Our group of 40 along with some other individuals were split into teams of 12. We were welcomed along with 100's of other volunteers from various states along the Eastern side of the country. They shared that as of noon that day, they had already processed 14,000 shoeboxes. A pastor prayed over those boxes with everyone and we were led to our work station. Each one of us had a specific job to do. After the boxes were inspected by 5 individuals in our group, they were passed along to the 2 people who would then tape the boxes shut. I had the task of scanning every boy shoebox in the 3 age categories along with the carton they would be placed into. Ken's job was to pack approximately 20 gift boxes into each carton, one for each boy age category. There were 2 others who did the same for the girl shoeboxes in the 3 age categories. From there they would go on the conveyor belt and then were loaded onto pallets several cartons high and then moved to the far end of the building. From there, fork lifts would move several pallets into the truck bays, loading them in tractor trailers for continued travels to ocean liners and international airports.

We were told that all of the shoeboxes that day would be heading to Africa, specifically to Tanzania, Ghana, Botswana, Libya, and South Africa. By the end of our shift at 5 PM, we had gone from 14,000 to 38,000 shoeboxes. Our leader Melissa was such an inspiration to us and each time we had a full carton of shoeboxes, she would shout out "Good News" & our job was to shout even louder as a team, "Great Joy".

Living Nativity 2025

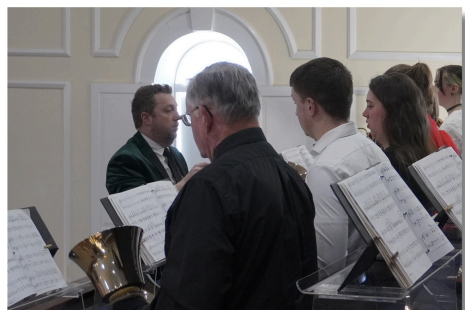
