Pastor's Pen

When I was about eight years old, my mother gave me an 8" by 11" placard to hang on my bedroom wall. The placard featured a color photograph President John F. Kennedy with an italicized quote from his 1961 inaugural address embossed at the bottom. The quote read: "Ask not what your country can do for you. Ask what you can do for your country." President Kennedy's words have reminded me throughout life, that we are called to serve others. Jesus, the ultimate servant-leader for all of humanity, teaches us and His disciples, what 'serving others' means from the Son of God's perspective.

35 Then James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came to Him. "Teacher," they said, "we want you to do for us whatever we ask." 36 "What do you want me to do for you?" He asked. 37 They replied, "Let one of us sit at your right and the other at your left in your glory." 38 "You don't know what you are asking," Jesus said. "Can you drink the cup I drink or be baptized with the baptism I am baptized with?" 39 "We can," they answered. Jesus said to them, "You will drink the cup I drink

and be baptized with the baptism I am baptized with, 40 but to sit at my right or left is not for me to grant. These places belong to those for whom they have been prepared." 41 When the ten heard about this, they became indignant with James and John. 42 Jesus called them together and said, "You know that those who are regarded as rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their high officials exercise authority over them. 43 Not so with you. Instead, whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant, 44 and whoever wants to be first must be slave of all. 45 For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life as a ransom for many." Mark 10:35-45

In today's society, we relish being served by others. Who of us would turn down the privilege that accompanies first class service on a flight, eating at a five star restaurant, receiving VIP treatment at a music venue, or being ushered to the front of the line at Disney World? John and James, disciples of Jesus, erroneously perceived their privilege of following Christ, as an automatic qualifier for the highest positions in Jesus' kingdom. But the heavenly kingdom of Jesus is

Recap: Arbor Day at the Mission



Children at the mission received small plantable trees to take home in celebration of Arbor Day. This is a two-fold blessing!



First Blessing:

The children are taught how to care for their trees, and to respect nature and the value trees provide. Fruit trees and shade trees were raised by the mission in their greenhouse, and distributed to the school children.

Second Blessing:

Planting trees also helps to reforest the country, which had suffered deforestation in the past due to the fact that charcoal is made from trees which people use to cook their food. The mission solely uses propane to cook food for the school children, providing a model example of alternative conservation efforts.

Arbor Day was a happy day for all of the mission's kids!
