# A Simple Gift, An Eternal Message

Operation Christmas Child is celebrating 30 years of God's faithfulness. Since 1993, over 200 million boys and girls have been delighted to receive gift-filled shoeboxes and discover how much God loves them. In addition to bringing great joy to millions of children in need, every gift has been accompanied with the Good News of Jesus Christ. Children are invited to follow-up discipleship through the Greatest Journey, a 12-lesson program designed especially for shoebox recipients. We praise God that over the last three decades, 50 million children who receive these shoebox gifts have gone on to complete The Greatest Journey discipleship program, learning more about how to follow

Christ each day. In the past 14 years alone, over 17 million children have made decisions for Christ Jesus and have come to know him personally as their Lord and Savior.

Hickory United Evangelical Presbyterian Church has a rich history with the Operation Christmas Child Ministry. 2023 marks our 26th year as a partner with this special project through the Samaritan's Purse. Thank you and God bless you for your support over the years. Since 1997, our church family at Hickory has packed and sent over 4,000 shoeboxes. What is really inside each shoebox gift that you prepare? Not just toys and other small gifts, but love, hope, joy, and an opportunity to share the gospel message with hurting children and their families around the globe. Last year in 2022, we collected 175 shoebox gifts here at our church. A total of 20,634 shoeboxes were collected from churches and organizations in our area and delivered to one of 5 locations here in Washington County. From there, the shoeboxes made their way to either Baltimore MD or Charlotte NC to be processed and finally shipped around the world. 9,303,130 shoeboxes were collected from the USA alone and the Worldwide total collection was 10, 599, 907shoeboxes last year. Praise the Lord!

We have OCC cardboard shoeboxes available in our greeting area which are provided at no cost. We will also have OCC plastic shoeboxes available for \$3 each, starting in mid Oct. To reserve your plastic shoe box, please contact Sue Alrutz at 412-576-5773 or at suealrutz@gmail.com. If you prefer to use your own box, whether cardboard or plastic, please be sure that it is a standard shoebox size. If you wrap your box, please wrap the lid and box separately. If you are unable to pack a box this year, please consider making a monetary donation to Operation Christmas Child. These donations assist with The Greatest Journey booklets and Bibles which are printed in every language.

Operation Christmas Child Shoebox Dedication Sunday is November 13 th. We prayerfully look forward to another successful and blessed year of giving, bringing the good news and love of Jesus into lives of millions of children. Please specifically ask God to prepare the way for the shoebox gifts to travel literally to the ends of the Earth, and to open the hearts of children and their families to receive the Gospel in the coming year. #### **GIFT SUGGESTIONS:**

School Supplies: crayons, markers, pens, pencils; sharpeners, stamps; ink pad sets, writing pads/paper, solar calculator, coloring or picture books, etc.

Toys: small cars, dolls, stuffed animals, balls, kazoos, harmonicas, yo-yos, jump ropes, small etch a sketch, toys that light up or make music with extra batteries, slinky, etc.

**Hygiene Items:** toothbrush and holder, mild bar soap and plastic soap dish with a cover, comb, brush, washcloth, etc.

Other: T-shirt, socks, ball caps, sunglasses, hair clips, inexpensive jewelry or watch, flashlights with extra batteries, soccer ball with pump, etc.

NO: toothpaste, candy, gum, used/damaged items, war related items i.e. toy guns, knives or military figures, chocolate, seeds, fruit roll-ups, drink mixes (powdered or liquid), lotions, medications, vitamins, glass items, aerosols, or any liquids.

# Community Blessing Box Opens 24/7 on Church Grounds


Folks may have noticed an addition to the Church campus recently. A bright, white, wooden boxed cabinet is the newest permanent fixture on the grounds, located between the flag pole and the entrance to Covenant Center gym. A placard above the box's door reads, "Take what you need, Give what you can, above all, be blessed."

This is the motto of the Hickory Community Blessing Box, a project initiative spearheaded by Girl Scout Troop 28883 members Kaitlyn Kaniuff and Christina Jones. The completion of the project fulfills requirements for them to achieve one of the highest awards in Girl Scouting - The Silver Award. To obtain the award, Girl Scouts must identify an issue they are passionate about, determine how it affects their individual community and then choose a project that will lead to a lasting change. The planning, development, implementation and completion of the project is also up to the Girl Scouts.

After their project proposal was presented to the Session of Elders and approved, Church Elder Fred Rasel assisted the Girl Scouts with construction and installation of their plan. The box is now fully operational and open to the public. To continue the sustainability of the blessing box, donations are being accepted for various items. Items can be dropped off in the donation box in the Main Entrance Foyer during Church Office operating hours: M-F 9a-3p or on Sundays before or after 10:00 am Worship Service.
