
EASTERN HILLS BAPTIST CHURCH 2025 GOAL -\$13.500

For the last 20 months or so, our weekly Prayer Meeting (5:45 pm on Wednesdays) has been focused on the "great prayers" of the Old Testament. We started this focus in January of 2024, and we started what will be our last unit in this series last night (I'm writing on Thursday morning). We have reviewed and thought through the great prayers of Abraham, Moses, Hannah, David, two of the prayers of Solomon, and the

prayers of Jonah, Hezekiah, Nehemiah, Ezra, and now Daniel. I decided to share the teaching that we looked at last night for this article.

Take a minute, if you can, and go read through Daniel's prayer in chapter 9, verses 3-19 of the book that bears his name.

What I want us to notice about Daniel's prayer isn't the situational context that precipitates it, but the personal context that does so. We know from his run-in with the wise guys in Daniel 6 that Daniel was a man with a devoted prayer life. After the shysters had convinced Darius to issue that edict prohibiting prayer to anyone but him (as if he could hear anyone's—much less everyone's—prayers!), Daniel just kept right on praying:

When Daniel learned that the document had been signed, he went into his house. The windows in its upstairs room opened toward Jerusalem, and three times a day he got down on his knees, prayed, and gave thanks to his God, just as he had done before. (Daniel 6:10, CSB)

As a result, he was thrown into the lions' den, and we know the rest of that story. However, we see one other aspect that moved Daniel's heart to prayer when we look at the first couple of verses of chapter 9: In the first year of Darius, the son of Ahasuerus, a Mede by birth, who was made king over the Chaldean kingdom—in the first year of his reign, I. Daniel, understood from the books according to the word of the Lord to the prophet Jeremiah that the number of years for the desolation of Jerusalem would be seventy. (Daniel 9:1-2, CSB)

According to this, Daniel was praying this prayer some time in 538 BC, and he was likely about 80 years old at the time. Daniel was not only a man of prayer—his prayers were prompted by his understanding of the Word of God. The prophet Jeremiah had to have been completed after Daniel was taken into exile. As a teen, he was taken in the first wave of those carried off to Babylon back in 605 BC, and the much older Jeremiah prophesied for another 20 or so years, especially if you include Lamentations. The book that we call Jeremiah was completed in about 586 BC. But Daniel had somehow obtained a copy of Jeremiah's scroll. Along with his other scrolls, which he specifically referred to as the Word of the Lord, Daniel was focused on God's Word when he prayed.

And what he saw in Jeremiah's prophecy prompted him to begin praying about God's promised delivery of Israel from the land of Babylon:

For this is what the Lord says: "When seventy years for Babylon are complete, I will attend to you and will confirm my promise concerning you to restore you to this place. (Jeremiah 29:10, CSB; See also Jeremiah 25:11)

Here's my point: The promises that God makes in Scripture are at least in part recorded to teach us what it is that we should pray for. Some questions for reflection:


- Why is study and reflection on Scripture so important for our prayer lives?
- How does your understanding and study of the Word inform your prayers?
- How can Daniel's example help us as we approach the Word in order to learn how to pray?

Let's engage in studying the Scriptures so that we might be more informed in our prayers, and pray that we might understand the Scriptures more thoroughly!
