Hope Clinic of McKinney www.hopeclinicmckinney.org

The Hope Clinic of McKinney is a place where they look to share the love of Christ by providing hope and healing for the whole person. Their vision is to become the full time medical home for over 1,000 uninsured residents in Collin County. They strive to create a space where everyone is treated with dignity, respect, and love while delivering high quality medical services and spiritual care. Hope Clinic provides health care services and resources to low-income, uninsured McKinney residents. Hope Clinic does not charge a fee for its services. They ask that patients participate in their care by making a donation to help cover the costs of another patient who utilizes Hope Clinic. However, no patient will ever be denied services based on their inability to donate.

Texas Free Care www.texasfreecare.org

Texas Free Care in Frisco is a faith-based healthcare clinic that provides basic medical care for patients that are uninsured or under-insured that have non emergency medical needs through on-site treatment as well as connecting points to additional resources. They accept all patients, adults, and children with no requirements of any kind, no prerequisites or documentations needed.

Frisco Family Services www.friscofamilyservices.org

Frisco Family Services has been dedicated to the City of Frisco for over 25 years. Their mission is to serve neighbors in crisis and to address their essential needs. They demonstrate care and support while helping families maintain their dignity as they navigate through difficult life situations. Through emergency financial assistance, food distribution through Frisco's only community food pantry, seasonal programs, adult life skills classes and more, they help those in the community who face tough choices between keeping food on their table, keeping utilities connected, or staying in their homes.

Based in Collin County, Cornerstone Assistance Network of North Central Texas is a faith-based nonprofit that takes a comprehensive approach to helping our neighbors in need. They provide temporary financial assistance when it is needed most, then work together to develop a budget and create a trusting relationship that allows Cornerstone NCT to address any underlying factors that have been standing in the way of their success. Above all, they draw upon the strength of faith to help others find the strength they need to turn their challenges into valuable opportunities for change. Cornerstone provides financial assistance, job placement, mentoring, coaching, and budget accountability to help neighbors create a lifetime of change.

Community Lifeline www.communitylifeline.org

Located in McKinney, TX, Community Lifeline's mission is "guiding local residents in crisis back to self-sufficiency and independence". Their goal is to provide firm footing to those experiencing a temporary crisis. Needs may range from financial support to food assistance and distribution of goods for seniors with transportation barriers in the 75069 zip code. Community Lifeline is dedicated to preventing food scarcity for all individuals and they work diligently to come alongside their neighbors in times of need.

Frisco Housing Rehabilitation Program www.friscotexas.gov

The City of Frisco receives Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funding, from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). Currently, the City of Frisco uses these funds to complete Home Rehabilitation services for eligible households that own their own home and reside in Frisco. Examples of projects include foundation repair, bathroom and kitchen updates, roofs, flooring, and handicap accessibility. The city can also provide up to \$5,000 (\$10,000 for HVAC) for emergency and minor repairs at NO COST to qualified homeowners. Examples of emergency repairs include leaky roof, heating and cooling system on the blink, toilets and drains backing up, leaking, or not working, and modifications to help someone with a disability.
