#### WEEKEND SERMON NOTES

Each week, this journal has a place to take notes and reflect on what you are learning through the teachings. We have provided extra space to jot down the big idea from the sermon, any questions you might have, important thoughts you want to remember and next steps towards Jesus you are ready to take. We pray this area will help you not just receive information but lean into the transformation that the Holy Spirit brings through His Word.

#### DAILY REFLECTION

Each day you will have the opportunity to slow down and reflect on how God is at work in your life. By taking time to notice His presence—in moments of joy and in seasons of challenge—you can cultivate deeper awareness, gratitude and trust in His guidance. Use this space to record your thoughts, prayers and reflections on who God is and what He is doing in and through you.

#### **ADVENT**

This edition of the Formation Journal is a brief departure from our typical structure. From now through the end of the year, as a church we will embark on a season of united, directed prayer. Each day in November, we will spend time before God praying through Scripture and asking God to align our hearts to His and give us direction. In the month of December, we will spend time walking through the season of Advent, preparing our hearts and minds to celebrate the birth of our Savior this Christmas.

#### SCRIPTURE AND PRAYER

#### **How to Read Scripture:**

**Read** the suggested Scripture passage. Try reading it aloud and thinking about each word or phrase.

**Invite** God to show you what He wants you to consider as you read the passage again. You can use the suggested reflection prompt.

**Respond** to God with gratitude, confession, joy or any other emotion.

**Rest** in God's forgiveness, assurance or whatever He might have for you.

**Return** to a word or phrase from the passage throughout the day.

#### **How to Pray:**

God invites us to communicate with Him any time day or night through the practice of prayer. Prayer is both talking to God and listening to the Holy Spirit. A simple way to pray is to think about the letters P-R-A-Y:

- P Praise God for who He is.
- **R** Repent of where I need forgiveness.
- A Ask God for what I (and others) need.
- Y Yield to the outcome.

You can use this suggested structure and the daily **Prayer Prompts** to grow in the discipline of prayer.

Advent is a season that reminds us, as followers of Jesus, that we are a waiting people. When we celebrate Advent, we identify with the people of God in the Old Testament who spent their lives waiting for the promised Savior-King. We also join generations of Christians who have longed for Jesus to return. Advent calls us to look back to His first coming in the manger and to look forward to His second coming in glory. This dual focus invites us to worship the risen and reigning Jesus who is coming again.

This Advent guide is designed to help you and your family journey through this sacred season together. Each week will focus on one of four lenses: **HOPE, PEACE, JOY and LOVE;** through a devotional that includes a song, reflection and prayer, along with daily Scripture readings. You'll also find verses from the Christmas hymn "Come, Thou Long Expected Jesus", a song that beautifully captures our longing for Christ. Consider using this devotional with your family, friends or community group to reflect on God's presence and promises.

A meaningful tradition during Advent is the lighting of the Advent wreath. Three purple candles remind us that Jesus is our reigning King who will come again, and one pink candle represents the joy we have as His children. On Christmas Day, a white candle is placed in the center to symbolize the victory of Christ's coming into the world. Each time you gather, dim the lights and light the candles, the glow will serve as a powerful reminder of God's light shining in the darkness.

This portion of the Formation Journal is meant to encourage God's formation in your soul, not to burden you with expectations. Feel free to adapt it to your context, embrace the beauty of flexibility, and may you be reminded throughout this Advent season that God is always present and near.
