When we are talking about progressive revelation, we are talking about the revealing of God's plan throughout history and throughout the Word pertaining to Christ Jesus.

1. Why does God need to reveal Himself?

Fellowship and communion with God was lost in the fall. Adam and Eve were created with identity, authority, blessing, and purpose. But when they chose to follow the enemy instead of God those things were distorted or lost.

3. How does God reveal Himself?

Through Progressive Revelation in His Word

Romans 16:24-26 "The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you all. Amen. Now to Him who is able to establish you according to my gospel and the preaching of Jesus Christ, according to the <u>revelation</u> of the mystery kept secret since the world began but now made manifest, and by the prophetic Scriptures made known to all nations, according to the commandment of the everlasting God, for obedience to the faith—"

Revelation = APOKALUPSIS," translated "revelation" here, means "disclosure"; from the root word apokalypto meaning "to take off the cover, to reveal"

John 1:17-18

Hebrews 1:1-2 "God, who at various times and in various ways spoke in time past to the fathers by the prophets, has in these last days spoken to us by His Son, whom He has appointed heir of all things, through whom also He made the worlds; who being the brightness of His glory and the express image of His person, and upholding all things by the word of His power, when He had by Himself purged our sins, sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high, having become so much better than the angels, as He has by inheritance obtained a more excellent name than they."

Matthew 13:16-17 "But blessed are your eyes because they see, and your ears because they hear. For truly I tell you, many prophets and righteous people longed to see what you see but did not see it, and to hear what you hear but did not hear it."

Old Testament Revelation was accurate but incomplete. They did not have the whole picture, only part of the picture. Only the shadow of the one who was projecting it.

4. Why did God reveal it this way?

Mankind wasn't ready for the fulness to be revealed until it could be observed in Christ.

Matthew 16:21-23 "From that time Jesus began to show to His disciples that He must go to Jerusalem, and suffer many things from the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and be raised the third day. Then Peter took Him aside and began to rebuke Him, saying, "Far be it from You, Lord; this shall not happen to You!" But He turned and said to Peter, "Get behind Me, Satan! You are an offense to Me, for you are not mindful of the things of God, but the things of men."
