

"Are We Home Yet?"

You know the feeling – you're in a car, truck, SUV, bus, van, plane, or train, and if there is a child around and if the trip will take more than five minutes – the question will come up: "Are we there yet? How much longer?"

A friend of mine, a long-time youth pastor, had a good solution: He would tell them how long the trip would take before they started, but every time someone asked, "How much longer?" His answer was "Twenty minutes." All the adults he worked with would give the same answer, "Twenty minutes." I think that's a great

way to deal with the frustration, at least from an adult perspective.

But the question still comes up, even when we go far past our teenage years. How much longer until I'm the person I want to become? How much longer until I can retire? How much longer do I have on earth? Am I home yet – no, not in my home on earth, but in my forever home? As we begin to lay out everything to get ready for Homecoming, I think it's a valuable question to ask. What does it mean to go home? Does our church, our faith, our community, tell us anything about home?


The idea of "homecoming" as a church body is that we have been the spiritual home or birthplace of many people through the years, and homecoming is a time to celebrate and remember how we have been home for people. And the idea isn't just an American idea – the British also have a homecoming Sunday every year – they call it "mothering day," as in going back to your mother church, the community that was your mother in faith.

But I think homecoming is more than that, as important as it is to remember, regather, and reflect. Homecoming is actually a reminder that our destination isn't just a church family on earth, but a reminder that we have an incredibly wide and deep home we all hope to get to. Whether we call it heaven, the new creation, the city of God, or just being with Jesus in eternity – we actually don't belong to earth – our origin and destination is the One who made the heavens and the earth.

So, the next time you ask those deep questions about who we are, where we are going, and what the point of it all is, remember that Homecoming is more than an event – it is preparation for eternal life that begins right now. And yes, please do invite friends, family, and those who were part of our church before, but who have moved elsewhere. Remind them that if they cannot physically come, they can join us online, and if they have passed from this life, they are no longer members of our church, but members of the church Triumphant and Eternal, and we will see them again!

And yes, I'll give you a breakdown of what we're doing in another article, but for now, get excited

about Homecoming, and invite the people you love to be part of it! Thank you for being part of our church family and our eternal family as well!

Financial Fundamentals October 2025

This report briefly addresses finances at FUMC Fox Hill. The latest information is in the weekly bulletin available at church or through our web site.

HALLELUJAH!!! Except for some sidewalk work by the Prayer Garden, our major repair and replacement projects on the Boiler, HVAC, and Roof are complete! Now, all we need to do is pay for them. The total project cost to date is \$216,106.90. Of that we have raised a very significant \$121,479.50. The balance was paid for through a loan we must pay back. Our wonderful congregation has really stepped up to this point and is continuing to make donations. This is your chance to help us avoid some interest payments. The year end is often a time when extra, special donations help us finish the year covering all our regular expenses. This year we still need it plus your additional help with paying down the loan. Thank you for your support to date and in the future!

Speaking of year end contributions, they are always needed just to pay our bills. At this point we are still behind on our Conference and District obligations and have not set aside planned reserve funds for future major maintenance. We need everyone's help. If you are fortunate to have stocks that have done well this year and/or have an IRA with a required minimum distribution, contributions to First Fox Hill can be of mutual benefit. Talk with your tax and/or financial advisor and touch base with Bill Bryan, Finance Chair, before taking any unfamiliar action, but don't delay and miss out.

Your latest giving statements should be out soon. These are not bills, but a way for you to help us make sure we have properly recorded the information which may be important for the upcoming tax time. Be sure to check yours as soon as you receive it and let us know of any issues, including if you don't receive one you expect.

Regular giving is usually the most convenient. Your contributions count whether they are through the offering plate, in the mail, or on-line. One way to help you stay up to date may be on-line where you can easily make one-time gifts or regular recurring

donations. Get started at our web site www.firstumcfoxhill.org by clicking on Give. If you are reading this online, click here for easy on-line access. Or use your camera to scan this QR code which is regularly seen in our publications and live stream. As noted above, those with IRA funds which must be withdrawn and/or appreciated stocks, may be able to achieve some added benefits by using them for direct contributions. Always talk with your tax and/or financial advisor before taking any unfamiliar action. Also talk with Bill Bryan, our Finance Chair, about your plans.

Also a beverage, preferably juice, and I am told that small cans of V8 are a preferred choice. Use paper bags and put the delivery date on the bag so that the ANW staff can track them for food safety.

Operation Christmas Child Shoeboxes

It's Shoebox time again! Through Operation Christmas Child, our church can help fulfill the Great Commission and share the Gospel around the world. A shoebox is more than toys and school supplies—it is a tangible expression of God's love.

Thirty-two years ago, Samaritan's Purse, a Christian relief organization, began Operation Christmas Child with just a few thousand shoeboxes collected by a church in Charlotte, NC. Since then, shoeboxes have been sent to 170 countries and territories. By God's grace, last year 11.9 million were sent from the United States, contributing to a worldwide total of 232 million.

Each child who receives a shoebox is also invited to participate in a 12-lesson discipleship program led by trained volunteer teachers.

In our Narthex, you'll find a display table with preprinted boxes and labels if you would like to prepare a gift. Please bring completed boxes back by **Sunday, November 23, 2025**—the Sunday before Thanksgiving.


