



Mid-November Jason sent out a request for prayer for a young boy who fell in a fire and had burns across the entire front of his body. They cared for him during the night and the next day they took him on an hour-long canoe trip downriver to meet Samaritan Aviation, a medical float plane ministry for an additional two-hour flight to the hospital. The boy remained unresponsive. Tribe leaders made arrangements for the family in town.

Jason wrote "Everything we could possibly do to help came together beautifully and with great speed. We don't think this is a coincidence. Please continue praying for Rops (pronounced "ropes") and his family. Dad is a new believer, and a guy I disciple. Mom is still on the fence."

In his last post, Rops and his dad are still in the hospital, but he is improving. He is having surgeries to keep the burns clean. The family comes to Jason's home nightly for news.

Many of Annemarie's friends and their families are disappearing, there are food shortages, and Nazi soldiers are marching in the streets. As Nazi relocation gets underway, she is worried about her friend Ellen and her family's safety. The Nazis won't stop, so Ellen moves in with the Johansens and pretends to be part of the family. Then Annemarie is asked to go on a dangerous mission. Does she have the courage to save her best friend's life?

I was fascinated to find that what I thought was a farfetched device involving a handkerchief towards the end of the story turned out to be a true to life fact which played a big role in the escape of the Jewish population.

This is an amazing story of courage, bravery, and kindness. It is estimated that with the help of many ordinary people 7,000 Jews living in Denmark crossed the sea to Sweden.
