

Over the years, through many moves, countless challenges, and seasons of growth, God has proven Himself faithful time and again - guiding us, shaping us, and providing what we need in every moment.

Each milestone marks a moment of God's kindness and the faith of his people. Every move, every challenge, and every new space has prepared us for this one. From living rooms to classrooms, from temporary tents to high-school auditoriums - God has been building His house through living stones.

WHERE WE ARE NOW: A TANGIBLE STEP OF FAITH

A year ago, Building Home was a vision - an act of trust that God would provide a permanent home for Union Church. Today, that vision has taken shape. By God's grace, we are now in escrow for a property in San Clemente that will soon serve as our first true home base for worship, discipleship, and mission.

This moment is a testimony to your faithfulness, generosity, and prayer - and to God's unmatched goodness to his church.

As we enter this new chapter, we are:

1. Moving From Vision to Reality

The dream of a permanent home is becoming tangible. Escrow is underway, architectural and permitting work has begun, and we can now see the space that our worship room, ministry spaces, and kids' classrooms will occupy.

We're halfway through the journey, and our invitation remains the same - pray, commit, give, participate, and trust. Every gift, every commitment brings us one step closer to opening the doors of our permanent home and welcoming generations to come.

WHAT IS BUILDING HOME

When we launched Building Home one year ago, we set out to do something bold - to trust God for both a spiritual and physical home. We knew that our church wasn't defined by walls, but by people. And yet, we also knew that a permanent home would allow our ministry to flourish for generations to come.

From the start, Building Home has been about far more than property or dollars. It's about formation, not just fundraising. It's about God shaping us into a people of

GOALS & OBJECTIVES

Primary Goal: 100% Engagement

Our first and primary goal has never changed - that every person who calls Union Church home would fully engage in the initiative.

Building Home is a discipleship journey before it is a financial one. It's about each of us taking a step of faith, learning to trust God more deeply, and joyfully joining in His work.





Secondary Goal: \$2.325 Million over Two Years

This goal represents our collective commitment to fund the next chapter of Union Church's life and mission - supporting our ongoing ministry operations while securing a permanent home for the future.



THE CORE OBJECTIVES: PERMANENCE, PEOPLE, PLANTING.

PERMANENCE - SECURING A HOME FOR GENERATIONS

Through God's provision, we are now closer than ever to establishing a permanent gospel outpost in San Clemente. Our property at 110 Calle Iglesia will serve as a central base for worship, discipleship, and mission.

With this facility, we will be able to:

- * Create a dedicated, consistent space for worship and ministry.
- * Provide expanded classrooms for Union Kids and adult training.
- * Establish offices and flexible ministry areas for weekday impact.
- * Deepen our roots in the city and serve our community with greater presence and permanence.







PEOPLE - EQUIPPING AND EMPOWERING LEADERS

A home gives us room to grow our greatest resource - people. As we move toward permanence, we are continuing to invest in:

- * Leadership development for staff, interns, and emerging leaders.
- * Volunteer training and engagement, strengthening every ministry team.
- * Pastoral care and discipleship, building a culture of maturity and health.

Our aim is to equip men and women who embody Jesus' character and push His mission forward.

PLANTING - EXTENDING OUR GOSPEL REACH

Union Church exists not just to gather but to multiply. As we build our home base, we are preparing to send - planting new churches and forming partnerships with local ministries to reach more people with the gospel.

This next chapter includes:

- * Establishing a pastoral residency and internship track to train future church planters and leaders.
- * Continuing to support local and global ministry partners through prayer, giving, and service.
- * Laying the groundwork for future church plants in Orange County and beyond.

Looking Ahead

Building Home The initiative has always been a two-year journey - but its impact will last far longer. As we step into the second half, we do so with gratitude and anticipation. Jesus isn't finished yet, so neither are we. Together, let's finish strong building a home where Jesus is exalted, lives are transformed, and generations yet to come will embrace God's call on their lives.







PHASES OF THE PROJECT

PHASE 1 Identifying the Space — Completed

Location: 110 Calle Iglesia, San Clemente.

After years of prayer, searching, and patience, God has provided a space that meets our needs and positions us for long-term ministry impact. This facility gives us the right footprint for worship, kids' ministry, discipleship, and community outreach - all within the heart of San Clemente. The property is now in escrow, marking one of the most significant milestones in Union Church's history.

PHASE 2 Funding & CUP — Now through February 2026

This is our current phase - a decisive period where prayer, generosity, and preparation converge.

To move from vision to reality, we are trusting God for \$750,000 between October 2025 and February 2026.

These funds will position us to close escrow and begin the vital work of permitting and preparation.

PHASE 2A. OCTOBER – DECEMBER 2025: → \$500,000 Goal

The next three months are crucial. These gifts will directly support:

- * Our down payment on the property.
- * Conditional Use Permit (CUP) work and city fees.
- * Initial tenant-improvement planning and architectural costs.

This stretch is not just financial - it's spiritual. Every gift represents faith, partnership, and obedience to God's call to build His house.

PHASE 2B. JANUARY – FEBRUARY 2026 \rightarrow \$250,000 Goal

The early months of the new year will help us finalize our CUP process, solidify architectural and design plans, and build the financial margin necessary to begin tenant improvements with strength and stability. We have already begun the CUP process, working closely with our architect and professionals who specialize in guiding churches through city planning and permitting.

PHASE 3 Getting the Keys & Making It Home — March – May 2026



This is where plans turn into progress and the fun begins.

Once escrow closes and permits are secured, we will begin the Tenant Improvement (TI) work that transforms the building into our church home. This phase will include:

- * Expanding restrooms and updating infrastructure.
- * Designing and outfitting Union Kids classrooms and flexible ministry rooms.
- * Refreshing the worship space, offices, and entry areas for warmth and excellence.
- * Implementing design touches that reflect our culture simple, beautiful, gospel-centered.

During this time, we anticipate beginning to use the facility for mid-week ministries, training, and prayer gatherings - taking the first steps of life in our new home even before full relocation.

PHASE 4 Move In - June 2026

By summer 2026, we plan to fully relocate to 110 Calle Iglesia and begin gathering for Sunday worship in our permanent home. This will be a historic and joy-filled moment - the culmination of years of prayer, sacrifice, and perseverance.

It will mark not an end, but a beginning - a launching point for decades of ministry, discipleship, and gospel influence in our city.



PHASE 5

Finishing Strong -March – December 2026

Even after we move in, Building Home continues.

The final phase of the initiative carries us through the end of the two-year journey, as we continue giving, celebrating, and finishing what we started.

To reach our full initiative goal of **\$2.325 million**, the remaining giving target from March - December 2026 is \$813,000.

This final stretch allows us to:

- * Fully complete our two-year goal, securing long-term financial health for the church.
- * Finish remaining facility enhancements and design elements as the space comes to life.
- * Build a healthy reserve to sustain growth, expand ministries, and fuel future church planting.
- Celebrate what God has done — not just with a building, but with a transformed people.

This phase is about gratitude, perseverance, and joy. It's about seeing the faith we began with brought to completion - not by our strength, but by His. As we give, pray, and serve together through the finish line, we are setting the stage for decades of gospel fruit in San Clemente and beyond.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQ)

01. What is the "Building Home" initiative?

Building Home is a two-year generosity journey aimed at establishing a permanent home for Union Church in San Clemente. It's not only about funding a building, but about forming a people - a family being built together into a spiritual house where the gospel can take deeper root and flourish for generations to come.

Q2. Where are we now in the process?

By God's grace, Union Church is in escrow for our first permanent home at 110 Calle Iglesia in San Clemente. We've begun architectural and CUP (Conditional Use Permit) work and are now entering a decisive season of funding and preparation that will carry us toward closing, construction, and eventually move-in.



How much have we raised so far, and what remains?

At the mid-point of our two-year initiative, God has already provided abundantly through your generosity.

Our total two-year goal remains \$2.325 million, and to reach it, we're trusting Him for the following key milestones:



- * \$750,000 (October 2025 February 2026) down payment, CUP, and initial improvement costs.
- * \$811,000 (March December 2026) completing the initiative goal and establishing margin for future ministry growth.

Every dollar given continues to move us toward full ownership and a lasting gospel presence in our city.

How will the funds be used?

The funds raised during Building Home will be allocated toward:

- * Securing our facility: Down payment and closing costs for 110 Calle Iglesia.
- * City and CUP requirements: Architectural, planning, and permitting expenses.
- * Tenant Improvements (TI): Construction and design updates including expanded restrooms, classrooms, worship space, and offices.
- * Future ministry strength: Building healthy financial reserves and supporting ongoing ministry operations as we grow.

What is the Conditional Use Permit (CUP), and why is it important?

A CUP is the city's approval process that allows us to operate as a church within our new facility.

It ensures that our property meets local requirements for safety, parking, accessibility, and community impact.

This process typically spans several months and involves architectural planning, environmental review, and city approval - a crucial step toward officially occupying and using our building for ministry.

06. What happens if we exceed our goal?

If God provides beyond our goal, any additional funds will strengthen our financial position as we enter our new building - enabling us to further invest in ministry, church planting, and long-term facility stewardship. Generosity beyond the goal will fuel the next chapter of gospel work at Union Church.

107. What if we don't reach the goal?

We're trusting God to provide everything needed, but if we fall short, we'll adjust timelines and scope as needed while staying faithful to the mission. Even then, our first priority will remain securing our permanent home and stewarding resources wisely. We will continue to communicate with clarity every step of the way.

108 How can I get involved financially?

There are several ways to get involved:

- * Make a new commitment if you've joined Union Church since Building Home began.
- * Increase your commitment if the Lord has expanded your capacity or deepened your faith.
- * Finish strong by fulfilling your current pledge with joy and perseverance.





All giving during this two-year period continues to support both Building Home and ongoing ministry operations through our One Fund approach.

09. What is the "One Fund" approach?

Rather than maintaining separate budgets, Building Home combines all giving into a single unified fund that supports both our ongoing ministry operations and the specific goals of the initiative.

This approach keeps giving simple and aligned. Every dollar given to Union Church directly fuels Building Home. There isn't a separate "building fund" reserved only for those who give above and beyond; instead, every act of generosity counts toward the mission of building a permanent gospel home and sustaining the ministries that fill it with life.

10. When will we move into our new home?

We anticipate moving into 110 Calle Iglesia in June 2026, following the completion of our tenant improvements, though this timeline remains fluid. This will be a historic moment: the culmination of years of prayer, generosity, and faith. After we move in, we'll continue giving and celebrating through the remainder of 2026 as we finish the Building Home initiative strong.

Week 1: Build with Humility

1 Samuel 16:1-13

WEEK 1 SERMON NOTES

Week 1: Build with Humility

1 Samuel 16:1-13

Theme: God builds greatness through humility, not visibility.

Gospel: Just as God chose the overlooked shepherd to lead His people, He sent Jesus—the greater Shepherd King—born in obscurity, anointed to rule through humility and grace.

Heart of the Passage: David's story begins in obscurity. While the world looks for strength, status, and strategy, God delights to build His kingdom through humility, dependence, and grace.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- **1.** When was the last time you got humbled in a funny or unexpected way? (Think: sports, parenting, cooking, tech fails, etc.)
- **2.** Why do you think God chose David the youngest, least likely instead of one of his older brothers? What does that reveal about God's priorities?
- **3.** How do we discern the difference between "false humility," which is still focused on self (self-deprecation), and true humility (God-dependence)?
- **4.** Where do you see a lack of true humility undermining your trust in God right now?
- **5.** How can Building Home be an exercise in humility for our church as a whole, and for each of us as members?
- **6. Bonus Theology Question:** The anointing of David in 1 Samuel 16 marks a shift from Saul's kingdom to God's kingdom from human strength to divine choice. How does David's anointing by the Spirit anticipate the anointing of Jesus, the true King empowered by the Spirit for His mission? See Isaiah 11:1–2; Luke 3:21–22; Acts 10:38.
- **7.** Jesus was the ultimate "unlikely king." What does His incarnation being born in obscurity, working as a carpenter, riding a donkey teach us about how God defines greatness?
- 8. David was anointed in secret; Jesus was crowned with thorns.
 - How does Jesus' humility His willingness to serve and suffer free us from striving for recognition or control and empower us to humility?

Week 2: Build with Courage

1 Samuel 17:31-50

WEEK 2 SERMON NOTES

Week 2: Build with Courage

1 Samuel 17:31-50

Theme: The courage to build comes from the God who already won the battle.

Gospel: David faced the giant with faith, but Jesus faced the greater enemy - sin, death, and the curse - and won the ultimate victory on our behalf.

Heart of the Passage: Courage isn't the absence of fear - it's the presence of faith. The real battle is believing that His power is enough. While others froze before the giant, David moved forward in confidence that God's power was sufficient.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. What's the most ridiculous or unusual fear you've ever had?
- **2.** Why do you think Saul was so eager for David to wear his armor? What does that reveal about how Saul viewed courage and strength?
- **3.** What kind of "armor" do people in our culture depend on to feel strong or safe? What "armors" are you tempted to depend on to make you feel safe approval, control, security, image, etc.?
- **4.** What "giants" tend to keep you from stepping forward in courageous faith? Get specific.
- 5. How can we distinguish between foolish risk and faithful courage?
- **6**. As Union stands in this defining "faith moment" stepping toward our permanent home how can we display courage like David's? What might courageous faith look like for you personally during this season.
- 7. Jesus didn't just show courage He gives us courage.
 - What does it mean that Jesus empowers us with courage?
 - Where do you most often forget or fail to believe this reality? (Think: parenting, vocation, finances, etc).
 - How can we take Jesus' courage into our hearts and actually walk in it?
- **8. Bonus Theology Question:** In facing Goliath, David acts as Israel's representative warrior he fights on behalf of the people, and his victory becomes theirs.
 - How does this scene foreshadow Jesus as our true representative and champion who defeats sin and death for His people? See Rom. 5:17–19; Heb. 2:14–15; 1 Cor. 15:54–57.

Week 3: Build for Eternity

2 Samuel 7:1-29

Theme: God's promises are bigger than our plans.

Gospel: God's promise to David of an everlasting kingdom is fulfilled in Jesus, the Son of David, whose throne and reign will never end.

Heart of the Passage: David wanted to build a house for God - but God wanted to build a house for David. The gospel always begins with receiving, not achieving.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. If you could build anything that would last forever, what would it be and why?
- **2.** Why is God's promise to establish David's throne "forever" so significant (vv.12-13, 16)?
- **3. Bonus Theology Question:** The Davidic Covenant is one of the major turning points in redemptive history.
 - How does this promise anticipate the coming of Christ? See Lk. 1:31–33; Acts 2:29–36.
- **4.** Why do you think God said "no" to David's desire to build the temple? What was He teaching David and us about His ways?
- **5.** How does David respond to God's answer (v.22)? How do you handle it when God says "not yet" or "no" to your good desire or request? What is God teaching us / doing in us when he answers in these ways?
- **6.** In your life right now, where do you sense God inviting you to trust His timing rather than rush your plans?
- **7.** What kind of "house" are you building with your life one of comfort and control, or eternal significance?
- **8.** How does the gospel free us from a preoccupation with our own name, recognition, honor, or legacy?
- **9.** How can our giving, serving, praying, and participation in God's work now ripple into eternal impact for generations to come?

Week 4: Build with Devotion

1 Chronicles 29:1-20

Theme: Finishing strong means willing, joyful, wholehearted generosity and devotion to Jesus.

Gospel: David gave sacrificially for a temple he would never see, but Jesus gave Himself completely to make us the living temple of God. His generosity inspires and empowers our wholehearted devotion.

Heart of the Passage: David's final act as king wasn't conquest - it was generosity. He gave freely, joyfully, and wholeheartedly for a work he wouldn't live to see completed. That's what devotion looks like at the finish line.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- **1.** Finish the sentence: "I know I'm really devoted to something when I _____."
- **2.** Augustine said that sin is "disordered love" love and devotion to good things, but in the wrong order. What do you think that means in practical terms? Why do you think God cares not only what we love, but how much and in what order we love it?
- **3.** How do your loves tend to become disordered? What are some good things that can subtly become ultimate things in your heart?
- **4.** Verse 9 says, "The people rejoiced because they had given willingly." What do you think makes giving joyful instead of dutiful?
- **5.** How does this passage challenge our human tendency to "give out of leftovers" rather than first and best?
- **6.** When you think about what makes you feel secure, what things come to mind first, and why?
- **7.** How do we rightly discern the difference between wisely stewarding resources and depending on them for security?
- **8.** How might finishing strong in this season of Building Home also mean reordering our hearts before God?
- **9.** David gave gold and silver; Jesus gave Himself. How does Jesus' generosity fuel our own generosity and redefine what devotion looks like?
- **10. Bonus Theology Question:** David gives sacrificially for a temple he will never see, yet his generosity sets the stage for God's glory to dwell among His people.
 - How does this anticipate Jesus, who gave Himself completely to make His people the living temple filled with God's Spirit? See Jn. 2:19–21; Eph. 2:19–22; 1 Pt. 2:4–5.
