

Sermon Discussion Guide November 2, 2025 Hebrews 11:32-40

- 1. Understanding "Simul Iustus et Peccator"
 - o Question: What does "Simul Justus et Peccator" mean?
 - o Why do you think this paradox is an impactful one for so many Christians?

2. Saint

- How does the Bible describe a saint, and how is this different from our usual perception of sainthood?
- Activity: Look up the word "saint" in the Bible. If you have a Study Bible, use the word index in the back. Or just Google: "list every passage that contains the word 'saint." What do you learn?
- 3. Seeing Ourselves as God Does
 - When does it become difficult for a Christian to see themselves as a saint?
 - Activity: Write down times when you've struggled or will struggle with your faith or identity.
 Discuss how remembering that you are a saint could change your perspective.
- 4. Faith and Struggles
 - Find the list of heroes of faith in Hebrews 11. How did they experience the blessing of their faith?
 How did they struggle?
 - o How do their lives inform you on what your life will look like as a believer?
- 5. Experiencing Disappointment and Perseverance
 - o What are the "three D's" mentioned in the sermon, and how can they affect your faith journey?
 - Discuss how God helping you to see yourself as a saint gives you proper expectations of this life and shifts your perspective on your struggles.

6. The Role of Faith in Suffering

- o Discuss how the story of the congregation member with ALS shows the power of remembering your status as a saint.
- o List the ways remembering you are a saint helps you in your struggles?
