“Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothes? Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they? Can any one of you by worrying add a single hour to your life?”

PROVISION FOLLOWS VISION, NOT JUST HUSTLE.

- Jesus names your anxiety

“Can any one of you by worrying add a single hour to your life?”

**1. What anxiety are you currently dealing with?
Is this anxiety chronic or situational?**

- Jesus shifts the focus and our orientation

“Your heavenly Father knows that you need them. But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well.” Matthew 6:32 -33

2. Does your anxiety/ worry help your situation?

3. How would your situation change if you focused on the provision (from God) rather than on the problem?

- God provides abundance not scarcity
Read Ephesians 3:20 (MSG).

4. Are you living under a scarcity view of life; in survival mode, living below your potential?

5. What does Ephesians 3:20 say about living a life of vision and full potential?

- God's provision follows a kingdom vision
But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well.” (33)

6. If money was not the ceiling, what kind of ‘Kingdom Story’ would you want your life to tell over the next 5–10 years?”

7. Write a two sentence 'Kingdom Vision' for yourself: 1) who do you want to become? and 2) who are you impacting and how is generosity involved?

8. Use your ‘Kingdom Vision’ to re-orient your view of what you have and how you will use generosity to move forward.

Remember that:

- Your biggest scarcity is not money; it was righteousness, and He covered it.
- Your biggest debt is not financial; it was sin, and He paid it.
- Your biggest need is not a raise; it was resurrection, and He gave it.
