## **BOTTOM LINE:**

Sometimes following God means giving something up so we can grow closer to him.

## **OBJECTIVE:**

Kids will identify something they may have to give up if they want to follow Jesus.

### **KEY PASSAGE:**

Genesis 22:1-19, Abraham is Tested

## **MEMORY VERSE:**

"Your word is a lamp for my feet, a light on my path." Psalm 119:105 (NIV)

## SUMMARY:

Those who travel into deep space must follow orders; even if those orders don't make sense, or are really hard to do. Abraham was willing to sacrifice the one thing he loved most because he trusted God's command completely.

**CHARACTER BREAKDOWN: 2M**

## **OBJECT LESSON OR KIDS SERMON**

### **ITEMS NEEDED:**

A bottle of soda

How many of you get a soda every time you go out to eat? Sodas are sweet and bubbly, and they taste so good with a burger and fries, or pizza, or Chinese food, or just about anything.

But there's a bad side to soda, isn't there? Soda is full of sugar, and it has nothing nutritional in it. Soda also usually has caffeine, a drug that can make you hyper and become mildly addicting.

Soda may taste good, but because it has zero nutritional benefit, many people choose to give it up. You'll rarely meet a professional athlete who drinks soda, and many people who simply want to be healthy give it up as well.

It isn't always easy to give up things we love, but sometimes a little sacrifice can be life changing. If God is asking you to give something up today, listen to him. Know that there's a good reason for your sacrifice, and do it, knowing that God will bless you for your sacrifice.

Sacrifice is never easy, but when we give things up for God, it's always worth it!



# LARGE GROUP GAME

## JUST THE ICING

## **ITEMS NEEDED:**

## LARGE GROUP LESSON

## **BOTTOM LINE:**

## **OBJECTIVE:**

Kids will identify something they may have to give up if they want to follow Jesus.

## **KEY PASSAGE:**

Genesis 22:1-19, Abraham is Tested

## INTRO:

It would be amazing to travel to Mars one day. Think how incredible it would be to set foot on a world no human has ever visited. Think how fantastic it would be to see the mountains of Mars, to lift rocks from the red planet's surface, and to study things men have only seen in photos.

Seeing Mars in person would be an unforgettable experience, but it's an experience that comes at a great price. Astronauts have to give up many, many things we take for granted just to qualify for a space mission. They spend long hours training, longer than most of your moms and dads normally work. They eat restrictive diets to make sure they are in the best physical shape possible. They spend hours learning how to operate their ship, how to do their experiments in space, and just staying physically fit.

Once the astronauts reach space, they have to make even more sacrifices. They can't eat normal food in space, so they are forced to eat freeze-dried food out of plastic packets, specially made for them. There's no McDonalds in space, so they get no breaks from the astronaut food they brought for the trip.

Astronauts also give up time with their families. On a mission to Mars, astronauts would give up a minimum of two years away from their homes and loved ones! Can you imagine being trapped in a tiny capsule for two years, missing all those holidays and birthdays, only rarely getting a chance to see or talk to someone on a video screen?

Astronauts make a lot of sacrifices, but to them, these sacrifices are a price they are willing to pay. They are happy to follow orders, no matter how strange, and to give up the things that NASA tells them. They do it because they want to see the galaxy up close and explore places never seen before.

## LARGE GROUP LESSON

Sometimes God asks us to make sacrifices too. He asks us to do things we do not understand. But like the astronauts following orders in the space program, there's a reason for everything that God asks us to do.

## **READ GENESIS 22:1-19**

#### MAIN POINT:

If you were here last week, you know Abraham was an old man when he had his son Isaac. God promised Abraham when he was already past 80 to make him a father. Isaac was a miracle!

So why did God tell Abraham to sacrifice his son? Because God wanted to test Abraham's faith. He wanted to know that Abraham would follow his orders, no matter what. God never wanted to take Isaac from Abraham, but he wanted to be sure that he, God, was first in Abraham's heart.

Abraham passed the test, and he set an example for us. If God asks you to do something that seems crazy, will you do it? Will you give up something you love, something important to you, so that you can draw closer to God?

## **DRIVE IT HOME:**

Part of being a Christian and growing in Christ is learning to let go of the things of this world. As people living in a sinful world, we are taught that the most important things in this world are money, power, good jobs, influence, and fame.

None of these things matter to God. What matters to God is that we love him and obey him. God asks us to give up some of our money every week to the church, to fund its ministry and to show God that we know our money belongs to him. He wants us to give up some of our free time to serve others and just to pray so that we can be a blessing to others. He wants us to give up things that would take us away from following Jesus, removing anything that would be an obstacle to growing in Christ.

Some of the things God asks us to give up are sins. If we truly love Jesus, we will give up the sins that Jesus died for. Sin not only keeps us from drawing closer to Jesus, it ruins our witness to the world. When we walk away from sin, we show Jesus and the people around us that our faith is real.

Is God asking you to give something up today? Is God nudging you to lay something at his feet so that you can grow closer? Whatever it is God is asking you to give up, it's not worth keeping. We need to obey orders, like the astronauts listening to mission control. We need to follow God's lead, no matter how strange it seems. We need to give up anything that keeps us back from God, knowing that when we make a sacrifice, God will bless us in return.

## IN THE CAR:

"Your word is a lamp for my feet, a light on my path." Psalm 119:105 (NIV)




## **PARENT TIME:**


What you need to know:

Are there things in your life holding you back from a closer walk with Jesus? Give them up to God, and ask him to take them away. Do not let anything hinder your walk with Christ.


