Join us as we celebrate all that God has done and look forward with expectation to what's ahead!

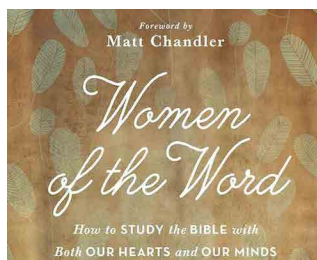
