


BRANSON AT BETHANY, DECEMBER 3 – Branson at Bethany is sold out. The only way to get a

A NOTE FROM THE ASSOCIATE PASTOR

As I am writing this, the Sunday ahead is November 30, the first Sunday in Advent. As we think about the season of Advent, I want you to think about John the Baptist. John's message was a message of repentance, and preparing the way of our hearts to receive the most beautiful, magnificent gift, of Jesus. We can view the season of Advent as one of waiting, but it is also a season of action. The prophecy in Isaiah 40 says to "prepare the way...make straight the paths." John the Baptist came as a witness to testify that Jesus was coming as "The Light of the World," and through that light, all men could be saved (based on John 1:6-8). John was only a man, not the Christ, and he was clear about this as he preached. John's purpose was clear, and that was to be the fulfillment of Isaiah's prophecy. "I am the voice of one calling in the desert 'Make straight the way for the Lord' (John 1:23). His message was one of action through preparation. This past Sunday we read Psalm 1 and Matthew 7:13-14 during worship. Both of these passages contrast the life of a faithful follower of Christ with one who is not. Are you a faithful follower of Christ, or not? The action of Advent needs to be that of introspection and repentance. I can suggest an easy way to do this during the season of Advent. Wake up each day and pray that the Holy Spirit would reveal any place in your life that isn't surrendered to him. Pray with anticipation that God will reveal areas in your life you are holding back. Confess your sin and pray that God will give you the strength to turn from all ways that are harming your shalom. I look forward to walking through Advent into Christmas with you, my church family!
