



Spring Hill Baptist Church Lancaster SC

Community Profile

Spring Hill Baptist Church is in the rural unincorporated community of Tradesville, in Lancaster County, SC. Tradesville is in northeastern Lancaster County, 5 miles northeast of Buford, 14 miles northeast of Lancaster, the county seat, and 10 miles west of Pageland (Chesterfield County). Tradesville got its name many years ago when it was the stopping place for trading when people traveled from areas of North Carolina to places in lower South Carolina like Charleston.

The South Carolina Baptist Convention provided us with a detailed demographic study of a 10-mile radius of Spring Hill Baptist Church. The following summarizes those findings:

The radius that was looked at centers itself at Spring Hill. Within this radius, the population is 24,402. There are 9,173 households and 6,648 families. The median age of the population is 41 years old. Our area has a mix of ethnicities but, is predominantly divided by White, Black, and Hispanic.

Family breakdowns that were discovered show us very important areas to focus on as we reach out into our community for the cause of Christ. Within the school aged students there is a prediction that early elementary aged students are on the rise. Most of the families in our study area are married with children. However, the single parent family is on the rise and projected to increase. The education of the area's population is varied in accomplished levels; many have a diploma or GED, others have attended some college. There are varied lower levels of those who have associate or bachelor's degrees, and even fewer have Graduate/Professional degrees.

The employed population is broken down in several factors: Managerial, Construction, Production, Transportation, and Professional/Specialty. There is also a good mix of Blue Collar and White-Collar workers.

For shopping, eating out, and entertainment, people generally go to Pageland (very small town with a grocery store and some fast food), Lancaster (numerous stores, including a super Walmart, local hospital, and growing Main Street area), and Monroe or Rock Hill (a thriving cities with lots of options on the way to Charlotte).
