Answering the call of God, Charlotte Bechtel moved west from her home in Michigan in 1965. She served first in Idaho, assisting church planters by teaching women and children. Shortly after moving to Payson, Utah, she added to her ministries by volunteering at KEYY in Provo, where she learned to operate the control board and use computers—new fangled devices in those days!

The station was purchased by Biblical Ministries Worldwide in 1988 and eventually became Key Radio, and Char has served on staff ever since. She has been the "glue" through three transitions in general management. Steve Barsuhn, who managed KEYY in the early years, says, "Char has been a terrific blessing to her co-workers through her caring, loving involvement in our lives."

Charlotte was honored in October for her 60 years of service with Biblical Ministries Worldwide. She continues as Public Service Director at Key Radio, but she also does many more tasks including administrative work, prayer team, and KeyCalendar60 announcements. If you call or email Key, it's likely Char will be the friendly voice on the other end. Her faithfulness to the Lord shines through everything she does.
