GIVE — One of the best ways to defend our faith is to prove it in acts of love. (Who can argue against loving kindness?) How might you progress in your acts of love for others?

GO — Ultimately, one must hear the gospel message to be saved which demands being ready to give an answer to all who wonder about the hope we have. What’s your plan to always be ready with an answer to win others over for Jesus?
