Liturgy for Home

Because of the weather, we are not able to gather in one place today.

But we are still gathering.

As followers of Jesus, we believe the Church is not a building but a people - united by God's Spirit, centered on Jesus Christ, and gathered around God's Word.

Today, we gather in our homes, trusting that God will meet with us and be present in our midst as we set aside time to worship Him.

Take time today to walk through this liturgy.

Don't worry about eliminating every distraction or making it perfect.

You'll find some light instructions for each element along the way.

Even though we are scattered this morning,

we hope this leads you to worship our God - together - wherever we are.

CALL TO WORSHIP

(one person reads out loud)

The LORD upholds all who are falling
and raises up all who are bowed down.

The eyes of all look to you,
and you give them their food in due season.

You open your hand;
you satisfy the desire of every living thing.

The LORD is righteous in all his ways
and kind in all his works.

The LORD is near to all who call on him,
to all who call on him in truth.

- Psalm 145:14-18, ESV

PRAYER

(pray on your own, or follow this simple prayer and one person prays it aloud)

Father in heaven, we come to you with our hearts and minds lifted in worship.

Please quiet our hearts. Gather our scattered thoughts.

Help us attend to your presence. Meet us through your Word.

Shape us by your Spirit and fix our hope on Christ.

Though we are in many places today, we come before you as one people.

Amen.

CONFESSION of SIN

(everyone read together)

Most merciful God,
we confess that we have sinned against you
in thought, word, and deed,
by what we have done,
and by what we have left undone.

We have not loved you with our whole heart;
we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves.
We are truly sorry and we humbly repent.

For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ,
have mercy on us and forgive us;
that we may delight in your will,
and walk in your ways,
to the glory of your Name.
Amen.

ASSURANCE of PARDON

(one person reads aloud)

Hear what comfortable words our Savior Christ says to all who truly turn to Him:

“Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest.”

- Matthew 11:28

Hear also what Scripture says:

“For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life.”

- John 3:16

“The saying is trustworthy and deserving of full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners...”

- 1 Timothy 1:15

“My little children, I am writing these things to you so that you may not sin. But if anyone does sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous.”

SCRIPTURE READING

(One person reads aloud. Listen not to evaluate yourself, but to hear Jesus describe the life He gives in His kingdom. After the reading, pause and share which blessing stands out to you.)

And he opened his mouth and taught them, saying:

“Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

“Blessed are those who mourn, for they shall be comforted.

“Blessed are the meek, for they shall inherit the earth.

“Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be satisfied.

“Blessed are the merciful, for they shall receive mercy.

“Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God.

“Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called sons of God.

“Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness’ sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

“Blessed are you when others revile you and persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against you falsely on my account. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven, for so they persecuted the prophets who were before you.

(everyone read together)

"Our Father in heaven,

but deliver us from evil.

BENEDICTION

(one person reads aloud)

Receive this blessing from the Lord:

"The LORD bless you and keep you;
the LORD make his face to shine upon you and be gracious to you;
the LORD lift up his countenance upon you and give you peace."
