PART 1: RECAP. HAVE SOMEONE READ THIS OUT LOUD.

We went back to verses 32-42 to look at the story of Jesus in the garden of Gethseman this past week to focus on the importance of following God's will even when it's difficult. Now, we are moving into Mark 15 to read about Jesus's trial before Pilate. This passage helps us learn how Jesus was unjustly condemned and still chose to take our place on the cross because of his love for us.

Why do you think the people demand that Jesus be crucified? Why did Pilate grant their request? Why do you think the soldiers mocked Jesus the way they did?
