Genesis

genesis

- **In Hebrew** (*beershith*)—“in the beginning”
- **In Greek** (*genesis*)—origin, beginning

If we possessed a Bible without Genesis, we would have a “house of cards” without foundation or mortar.

Moses wrote the Pentateuch *genesis*

- The first five books of the Bible: Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, and Deuteronomy.

Deuteronomy 34:5-6



“So Moses the servant of the LORD died ...
in the land of Moab and ... no one knows
the place of his burial to this day.” (ESV)

Reason #1



He was uniquely qualified. Moses had a superior education—raised in the courts of Pharaoh; trained to read, write, speak, and lead.

(Acts 7:22)

Reason #2



Both Jewish and Christian tradition ascribe the Pentateuch to Moses.

Reason #3



The Pentateuch recounts God's instructions to Moses to write (Num 33:2; Deut 27:3; 31:24)

“Then the Lord said to Moses, ‘write this as a memorial in a book’” (Ex 17:14, ESV)

Reason #4



Old Testament writers refer to these books as the Law of Moses (Josh 8:31; Ezra 6:18; 7:6; Neh 8:1; 13:1; Dan 9:11)

“And keep the charge of the Lord your God, walking in his ways and keeping his statutes, his commandments, his rules, and his testimonies, as it is written in the Law of Moses”

(1 Kgs 2:3, ESV)

Reason #5



New Testament writers ascribe it to Moses
(Mt 8:4; Mk 12:26; Lk 16:19; 20:28; Jn 1:45; 5:46; Acts
6:11; 2 Cor 3:15; Heb 9:19)

“For it is written in the Law of Moses.”

(1 Cor 9:9, ESV)

Reason #6



Jesus himself ascribes it to Moses (Mt 8:4; Mt 19:8; Mk 7:10; 12:19; Lk 16:31; Jn 1:17; 7:19)

“And beginning with Moses and all the Prophets, he [Jesus] interpreted to them in all the Scriptures the things concerning himself.”

(Lk 24:27, ESV)

When was it written?



- Genesis was written after the children of Israel left Egypt (1445 B.C.), but before Moses died (1405 B.C.)
- **Of Note:** The time frame of Genesis runs from the creation of the world through the children of Israel in bondage in Egypt. It covers more time than the remaining Bible books combined.

Why was it written?



To record God's creation of the world and his desire to have a people distinctly set apart to worship him.

Identify the “*Toledot's*”



“These are the generations of ...”

(ESV)

There are ten sets of generations (*toledot's*) recorded for us between Creation itself and Israel's enslavement in Egypt.

Ten Sets of Generations



- **Gen 2:4**—“These are the generations of the heavens and the earth when they were created.”
- **Gen 5:1**—“This is the book of the generations of Adam. When God created man ... in the likeness of God.”
- **Gen 6:9, 10**—“These are the generations of Noah. Noah was a righteous man.”

Ten Sets of Generations



- **Gen 10:1**—“These are the generations of the sons of Noah.”
- **Gen 11:10**—“These are the generations of Shem.”
- **Gen 11:27**—“Now these are the generations of Terah.”
- **Gen 25:12**—“These are the generations of Ishmael.”

Ten Sets of Generations



- **Gen 25:19**—“These are the generations of Isaac.”
- **Gen 36:1**—“These are the generations of Esau (that is, Edom).”
- **Gen 37:2**—“These are the generations of Jacob.”

Foundations for a Proper World View *genesis*
