
















This week I'd like to share a few more book recommendations for those of you who might be looking for some good fall reading!

My first recommendation is "The Kingdom New Testament – A Contemporary Translation" by N.T. Wright. I'm a big fan of N.T. Wright's books, so when I learned that he had taken time to write and publish his translation of the New Testament, I immediately ordered it. What I love about his translation is that it uses contemporary language, but he translates it sentence for sentence. (The Message translation is also in contemporary language but sometimes Peterson chooses to translate 2 or 3 sentences in a paraphrase that helps to get the point across.) The other thing I appreciate about Wright's translation is the way he translates Jesus as King. N.T. Wright is British, so his personal understanding of monarchy and royalty is much better than an American's understanding. When he translates "King Jesus," you really get a sense of what the Scripture is trying to say. This is a wonderful translation to have in addition to other Biblical translations, and it reads a bit like a book even though it's 100% Scripture.

My second recommendation is for anyone who wants to learn a bit more about the enneagram. "The Journey Toward Wholeness" by Suzanne Stabile is an excellent text for understanding why people do what they do and how to use the enneagram as a tool for personal and even spiritual growth. Suzanne Stabile lives in Texas and has been a pastor's wife for decades. She has studied the enneagram under Father Richard Rohr, and she has taught numerous conferences over the years to help people learn more about the enneagram. Her writing is concise yet bursting with information. I found her knowledge to extremely useful in application as well as education. So, if you'd like to learn more about the enneagram and how it can be useful in your relationships, I'd recommend this book.

And my last recommendation is "A Grief Observed" by C.S. Lewis. In this book, Lewis essentially takes the reading through his own process of grieving the loss of his beloved wife, Joy. He is honest in his statements about his experiences as well as in his questions about why God would allow this kind of pain in the world. Ultimately, he is drawn into the truth of how God is deeply involved in the suffering of God's people, and what that means for those of us who calls ourselves Christian. Although this book isn't very long, it will take some time to get through it simply because Lewis' writing is full of depth and meaning.

Next week, I'll share more about some of the adult classes I hope to be able to offer for Mid-Week as well as the WD40 and DMV discipleship groups.

Reports from Liz, Heather and Doyle were reviewed.

Saturday, August 26, 2023 from 2:00-5:00 p.m. at the Maurice, lowa Reformed Church the Kingdom Network Great Plains Hub launch gathering will take place. Consistory members, staff and congregation members are invited for worship and fellowship.

Russ covered property issues from the summer – retention pond with the riser pipe has been resolved; we've received a letter from the city regarding a complaint(s) regarding the growth of weeds/grass along fences; and a tree growing at the west end of the back parking lot. Russ called the city regarding the weed/grass growth and they were coming out to check on it but were informed we are responsible for the growth on our side of the fences. The tree will be removed.

The north rooftop HVAC unit is not working correctly. It will cost approximately \$10,000 to repair and a new unit will be approximately \$35,000. It was decided to not repair it and use the south rooftop unit which has very few hours on it and we will replace as needed in the future as one unit is sufficient for the worship center needs.

A new sound system is here; more speakers are needed at a cost of \$30,000-\$40,000.

The church will be sponsoring a marriage seminar tentative in the fall/winter; details are being worked out.

Madonna Graanstra is leaving the head of the gift card program and Teresa Hoogendoorn will take over the responsibilities. MSA to change the gift card account from US Bank to First Interstate Bank with the rest of our accounts.

Mission Haiti has a group going to Haiti to assist with the distribution of school supplies and the start up of school programs. They've asked for prayer support and monitary assistance. MSA to provide \$500 for each person going. They will be gone September 1-8. Those planning to go are Jaron and Craig DeWit, Doug Harms, and Tony Boer.

Next meeting will be September 14.
