CHS averages 78 people per day with an average stay length of 21 days. New commercial kitchen serves over 950 meals and snacks a week for guest for total of over 40,000 cartons of milk and 25 tons of food each year. Along with crisis housing, CHS offers 24 hour crisis hot line, free counseling, parenting education, support groups, community ed, and rural outreach. www.chssd.org.

I want to encourage you to mark your calendars for the September 7 Kick Off Sunday and for September 14, which is the first week of Sunday School.

I am so thankful for everyone who has replied to my emails, texts, and calls regarding Sunday School volunteering. Even if your response is "not right now" it is nice to hear from you, and your encouragement is appreciated.

We are getting closer to having our Sunday School needs met for fall, but we still need a few more of you to plug in.

- Helpers for Pre-K and Kindergarten classes- assist the teachers in helping the kids learn
- One more helper for 1st Grade
- One more teacher for 4th Grade

We also love to have as many substitutes as possible to offer maximum flexibility to regular teachers and helpers.

- In general, we try to recruit two volunteers for each role so that each person will only serve half of the Sundays. With Sundays off for Holidays, that means you are only committing to 15 Sundays per year. You and your co-volunteer will work together to set a schedule that works for you and if neither of you can take a week, we call on substitutes to fill in.
- The lesson plans are in the classroom along with all of the needed supplies. You just need to pray, read the lesson, and show up for the kids. Sunday School is from 10:10 to 10:40, so it is a fun filled half hour.
