It is September. My thoughts this week have been on many of church friends who are going through some rough places in their lives right now. Those who are still recovering from deep loss and those who are battling cancers and deep emotional/spiritual pain. The world is broken, and it is always there before us. God will be near because God is that way. I pray our folks in those places will experience that truth. It is so comforting and empowering to get through the next hours, days, weeks and yes, even years. My thoughts are on the fall and the new series, which I am still working on. I am really wanting to do something that will enhance the calling I am feeling for our presence on this street we call Faith. It is not that we haven't done well up to this point, but I do believe so much has changed here and that has brought a new sense of purpose and calling for what we can all do for the sake of others and the great work of the Kingdom. First, we build our own faith walk. There is always room for that. Then we consider others who are also seeking that. (They may not even be aware of such a need.) Finally, we set an intentional strategy to bring "The Word" to them. I'll still working on it, but it is starting to take shape.
