Suppers 6 Note Changes


Thank you to all who participated in Suppers 6. We had a good response and a fun night making new friends.

As I look out my window, it seems like I'm inside a snow globe! Strangely, in my line of work, that means it is time to think about summer!

CAMP: Community has seen the impact that Christian Summer Camp can have on kids, so Community makes camp more accessible to families by paying half of the early registration cost for students interested in camp. Most of our kids go to Inspiration Hills, although we have had a few kids attend other camps in the area as well. High School and Middle School students should chat with Doyle about any camp and summer options he plans to offer as well.

When you sign your child up for camp, it gives you the option to have church pay part of camp. Just divide that early registration rate in half, and that's the amount you can tell camp to bill to Community. Then send me an email so we know to watch for your child's invoice to come through. Here is the Inspiration Hills link: https://www.inspirationhills.org/summer-camp/. They offer day camps and overnight camps, all the way through high school age. There are specialty camps like Saddle Up and Wilderness Camp. There are also camps for families and grandparents to attend with children. The early bird deadline isn't until April 15, but some of the camps fill very quickly.

VBS: While you are working on summer plans, save the date for Vacation Bible School from July 22-25, 2024. Our VBS is in the evenings and this year our theme is "Found!"
