Hello,

I bumped into an article that was shared on Facebook by a friend. The article is from Keloland living. I don't often share articles like this, but it struck me as one with potential to be particularly helpful for all of us. It is a conversation with one of my former colleagues who is just a lovely human and she is talking about dealing with kids' big emotions. https://www.keloland.com/keloland-living/dealing-with-kids-big-emotions/

You may not be aware that in my past career experience, I got to receive training in de-escalation, which is to help when someone, often children and adolescents, are experiencing an emotional or behavioral crisis. I'm not an expert at all, but I did find the training I received to be very helpful. I'm also going to get a little vulnerable with you in this newsletter note and say that this is something that I continue to ask God to change in me every day and He has been so faithful in doing that.

The article from Keloland living was such a great reminder for me, not just in spending time with little kids, but with older kids, teens and even adults too. I once heard someone describe helping an upset child as meeting their storm with calm. I keep thinking about how often we meet a child's storm with our own storm because the behavior a child exhibits in crisis/struggle is stressful, inconvenient or even scary. I think of how often I've responded to my own kids or others in dysregulation with my own stress and dysregulation because that is so natural. This story addresses dysregulation in such a practical way. Even as we all meet people in stressful situations, whether that is kids or adults (increased by staffing shortages in customer service scenarios, or covid worries, or personal struggles, or anything else) it is a good reminder for me that humans in dysregulation have a tough time hearing/ processing/ thinking through the situation. I love using too many words (as evidenced by my frequently long newsletter notes) but sometimes talking someone out of their stress is not helpful until they've had the time, space and tools to regulate and be able to process their emotions and then the information. Kids need extra support because they don't have the tools to regulate AND they don't have the experience yet. This has been so hard for me to remember with my daughters at times, but I'm still growing and learning too. Their grace and God's grace are very appreciated when it comes to this topic.

I think in terms of my walk with Jesus, this topic hits in such a beautiful way. Jesus meets our struggle/ dysregulation/ storm with calm. He can literally calm any storm. He has calmed a physical storm, but He has also calmed the metaphorical storms within us. He is always in control of His own feelings and never meets our crisis with His own drama. He is not embarrassed by our mess or afraid of our yelling. He is simply present and deeply loving. I pray that God can keep helping me change to be more like Him. If you ever have a tough time with a specific kiddo in this way and want some practical tools, feel free to reach out. Again, I'm not an expert, but I am willing to help. So, if you are finding this to be a tough area, or wishing you could go back in time to do a moment better, remember that you are not alone and that God is working patiently with you.

Voice of Martyrs – Have a movie coming out about VOM story. Mike H. would like to have the movie at Church. Looking at sometime in early spring.


