


Hello Everyone!

The Christmas Program is sneaking up VERY quickly! I'll be giving the lines to K-5 kids who are doing individual lines soon. I'll put out the songs for the K-5 kids soon as well. K-5 kids already have their group lines (see below.) The preschool kids can practice their whole program at home. They've been practicing on Sunday mornings, and it is sounding so sweet! We're having a Birthday Party for Jesus! The program is at 4pm on December 4. Preschool kids will arrive around 3:45pm. K-5 kids will arrive at 1pm on that day and stay until the program starts.

For the younger kids (haven't gone to Kindergarten yet), we do practice during the singing time at Sunday School each week. The words for songs were handed out to parents and are also on our web page at https://communityrc.org/children. The preschoolers can wear whatever outfit parents want to put them in. Most usually wear their "Christmas outfit" or "party clothes." We mostly just want them to be comfortable and have fun! K-5 kids will have just one big practice! We'll get together from 1-4 pm on 12/4/22 (the day of the program) to get ready for the main event! We're hoping everyone can learn their line in advance, so we'll practice the lines and songs a little in Sunday School and we'd appreciate your help in teaching your child the part for
