Do you feel it?

Do you feel that uncomfortable pull and tightness when you realize we are already past the midline of October?

Do you feel the twinge in your gut when you realize there was no stopping the hectic, frenzied pace of summer and that it continues right on through to today? Do you see that your calendar, which you thought at the very least would become more scheduled and doable, has actually *increased* in intensity?

Do you feel the temptation to **not** live in the present, where you could see the beautiful changing of the trees, *smell* the cooling ground, *hear* the birds preparing for and migrating south for the winter, *feel* the crispness of the morning air, and *taste* the bounty that comes with this fall season, but instead you have found yourself living in the future by planning for an already over-committed Christmas season?

Have you stopped long enough to consider what living like this is doing to you?

To your spouse? To your kids? To your friends? To your work?

To your relationship with God?

Mark 8:36 says, "What good is it for someone to gain the whole world, yet forfeit their soul?"

Another translation says, "What good would it do to get everything you want and lose you, the real you? What could you ever trade your soul for?"

I'm all for being involved in programs and activities and for participating in events that are meaningful and lifegiving. But if any of those things come at the expense of your relationship with God, if any of them take away from your time with Him, if any of them tear down your soul rather than build it up, then they are simply not worth it. You might think that's a pretty stiff test for deciding whether or not an activity is worth your time, but I have a sneaking suspicion that our wise, Jesus-loving friends who have lived many decades would say life is too short to be spending time on things that don't have some kind of eternal Kingdom significance.

It's not too late, you know.

It's not too late to reclaim your life.

It's not too late to say no to certain things.

It won't look the same for everyone, but I know that if you give your daily life and all its commitments to the One who cares the most about you, He'll help you plan it in a way that is life-giving to everyone.

It won't be easy, but I guarantee it will be worth it.
