And lastly this week, I saw a wise saying come across one of my social media feeds that I think might be a helpful for some of you. The saying was, "Only consume as much as you can pray for." And it was regarding media and the infinite feeds we can watch, hear, and read every day. The saying makes an excellent point. It's possible in today's world to consume so much information from media sources of all types that we can become absolutely overwhelmed with what we see. We have no way to process all that information. Overconsumption of media can lead to anxiety and depression, among many other things. However, if we limit our consumption to what we feel we can adequately pray for, we acknowledge that we can't do it all. But then we can pray, and in doing that, we acknowledge that God can do something! We can't pray for it all. We can't carry it all. We were never meant to! Only God can do that. But we can participate in doing something about it by praying over it. Putting limits on what we consume is a way to humble ourselves and admit that we are not God, and praying about it also allows God to be God. So, if you find yourself in a position where you're feeling overwhelmed by the state of things, or you feel helpless to make a difference, you might want to think about that quote. Turn off the media for the day, pick something (or things) to pray for, and leave it at that. "Only consume as much as you can pray for." And leave the rest in God's hands. He's more than capable.
