# MIDDLE SCHOOL & HIGH SCHOOL

We are in full swing here at Community and I know that calendars are full and there is a lot going on for students, so I am thankful for those opportunities that we get together as a youth group. While other things also pile up on the calendar I understand that it is impossible to plan something that doesn't interfere with one or more other things going on. It is just that time of year and so we try our best.

In October, that starts with our middle and high school event. Like past years, we will be heading out the Heartland Country Corn Maze. The date this year is Sunday, October 23rd from 6:00 – 7:00. Students will meet out at the corn maze again this year and will want to make sure to dress to the weather. We could be looking at a wide range of temps so keep that in mind.
