This week, I want to write about something that has been sitting heavily on my mind: HURRY.

These past few weeks, I have had an unusually high number of tasks to accomplish, people to meet, and places to be, and this schedule will continue for several more days. After a couple of weeks of this, I found myself in a state of constant high alert. My anxiety was higher. I was tired. And I just had a general sense of unrest in my soul. Have you ever felt that way? As soon as I realized what I was feeling, (we rarely notice that feeling immediately because it takes time to build) I had to stop myself and really check my heart and mind. Why was I rushing around like this? When did hurry become such an idol in my life?

Dallas Willard writes about hurry in this way.

"I would say hurry is a state of frantic effort one falls into in response to inadequacy, fear, and guilt. We should take as our aim to live our lives entirely without hurry. The peace and joy and strength which God intended for human life, the well-being and health of mind and body, is inconsistent with living in a hurry. (Of course, occasional bouts of hurry may be reasonable in such a world as this. But chronic hurry is not.). The good of avoiding hurry is not just pleasure, but to enable us to calmly and effectively do the things that are truly important with strength and joy."

A couple of years ago when I first read those wise words from Dallas, I took them to heart and began a daily intention of living without hurry. If I found myself rushing in my car, I made a conscious effort to slow down. If I found myself in the longest line at a store, I would remind myself that there might be a God purpose there somewhere. If I found myself trying to fit more and more errands into the same 30-minute time frame, I literally would stop and say to myself, "Slow down. Things will get done without your rushing. It will be ok."

What caught me this week was that my intention to live unhurriedly got thrown to the side so easily and so quickly that it took me *days* before I realized that I was living in a rush! Finally, my body reacted to the hurried pace in such a way that I was forced to stop and take stock of my heart and soul, only to realize, disappointingly, that I had been hurrying again. I had to then take time to literally breathe. Literally slow my steps. Even slow my typing speed and intensity! I had to remind myself that this hurry was damaging not only to my physical body, but to my soul as well.

Those are strong words from Dallas, but they are true. If we want to live in such a way as to cultivate the joy, peace, and strength that God offers us, we cannot live in a constant state of rushing. It will be to our detriment if we do so.

This week, if you're feeling rushed, anxious, hurried, unsettled, fearful, inadequate, or even guilty, I encourage you to make a conscious effort to live more unhurried. Slow down. Things will get done. And if they don't, will it truly matter in the long run? I'll be joining you on this journey.



Hello Everyone! I have a lot to share with you this week.

We have a lot of fun and you won't need to lead or prep. Just come be the caring adult with time to listen, connect and enjoy the kids as they learn and grow together. You can pick one week, a few weeks, or every week! © Recruit some friends to join you. Ideally, it would be fun to have 2 adults (plus Heather) during the lesson time and 1 more during the play time before class.

The next thing that needs your attention is the Kids Christmas Program. We're having a Birthday Party for Jesus! I'll need some adult helpers for this as well so please save the date and plan to lend a hand. The program is at 4pm on December 4. Preschool kids will arrive around 3:45pm. K-5 kids will arrive at 1pm on that day and stay until the program starts.

For the younger kids (haven't gone to Kindergarten yet), we do practice during the singing time at Sunday School each week. The words for songs will be handed out to parents so you can practice. The preschoolers can wear whatever parents want to put them in. Most usually wear their "Christmas outfit" or "party clothes." We mostly just want them to be comfortable and have fun!

K-5 kids will have just one big practice! We'll get together from 1-4 pm on 12/4/22 (the day of the program) to get ready for the main event!

We're hoping everyone can learn their line in advance, so we'll practice the lines and songs a little in Sunday School and we'd appreciate your help in teaching your child the part for their grade level at home.

Parts & Lines for each Grade:

- Everyone: For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life.
- Kindergarten: Sheep- It is good news of great joy for all the people.
- 1st Grade: Angels- "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to men on whom his favor rests."
- 2nd Grade: Magi- "When they saw the star, they were overjoyed."
- 3rd Grade: Animals- camel, cow, bird, etc.-"she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in swaddling clothes, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn."
- 4th Grade: Shepherds: "Let us go to Bethlehem, now, and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has made known to us."
- 5th Grade: Mary, Joseph, Innkeeper, Herod, Star, Townspeople, Group Leaders, sign holders, etc.-In him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome. May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit."

Kids will get a sign-up sheet during Sunday School to let me know which K-5 kids want to participate. Either fill out that yellow sheet and send it back OR send me a quick email with your child's preferences from the list below. 10/30/22 is the last day to let me know if kids want a solo or speaking part as I'll need to give everyone time to practice in November. Here are the choices:

- group speaking part only (see above- all kids do this)
- individual speaking part (these will be video recorded prior to program and on screen)
- sing a solo (we'll schedule a time or two to practice together, otherwise practice is at home.)
- sing a duet or trio (we'll schedule a time or two to practice together, otherwise practice is at home.)


