LUKE 1:26-38

TALK ABOUT IT

• **ICEBREAKER:** What's something you said 'yes' to before you fully understood what you were getting into?

- Mary said "Let it be" before she saw any evidence. What is something in your life right now that requires trust before you can see the outcome?
- Christmas shows God closing the distance & giving us His full attention. How does this reshape the way you see yourself, and how does being "highly favored" challenge how you see your worth?
- Like the pastor's son said, "Are you going to be right there?"
 How have you experienced God's nearness giving you courage, especially when something felt too big for you?
- Mary knew she was seen, so she could say, "Let it be." What does being fully seen by God free you to surrender right now?
- Because Mary said yes to carrying Jesus, we can say yes to holding Jesus in our hearts. What does Mary's willingness teach you about responding to God's promises for your life?
- Mary received a specific promise and so do we. Which of the promises the pastor read feels most personal to you right now, and why?
- Mary faced something humanly impossible yet trusted because God offered hope. Where in your life do you need to hear God say, "This looks impossible to you, but My word will not fail"?
- How would your daily life change if you truly rested in God's promises instead of relying on your own strength?
- What is one specific area where God is inviting you to say, "I am the Lord's servant... let it be as You have said"?
- After hearing Mary's story and reflecting on God's generosity in his attention, promises, power & provision, what is one small, practical step of obedience you can take this week that reflects a 'Let it be unto me' posture toward God?
