Built a new sanctuary and expanded the footprint at 1850 N. Fairfield Road.







5 NEW LOCATIONS

We have a relentless passion to reach first-church people. Our reach potential is not limited by a single location. To reach 5,000 lives through baptism, our strategy is to launch 2 new Be Hope campuses and 3 Hope Beyond Bars locations.

EXPAND OUR BEAVERCREEK FOOTPRINT

Our future locations will be as strong as our foundation. Our Beavercreek location serves as the main campus, championing new faith, developing, equipping, and sending 500 leaders to live out their purpose in new communities. We will expand our current facility to accommodate more first-time guests, new families, and kids by Fall of 2027.

IRONTON NEW LOCATION & RELAUNCH

In an effort to expand Ironton's impact, we will make room for first-time guests and those new to faith by selecting a new location and relaunching Ironton campus with new strategies and structures that mirror our current plan for launching new campuses. Week 1 | When God Does More Than Enough

Over the years, as I've leaned into the discipline of giving, it's become one of the most meaningful and faith-building parts of my walk with God. I've learned that giving is something you have to do to understand how powerful it is. You can hear about it, read about it, or watch others do it, but the peace, growth, and closeness to God that come through giving only become real when you experience it yourself.

It didn't start with me. I grew up watching my parents tithe. I knew enough about money to know it was a sacrifice for them, but they always gave faithfully. That example stuck with me, so when I started working after college, I decided if I said I believed in God, then I needed to live like it. The Bible is clear about giving, and I wanted to experience everything God had for me. It seemed like a lot of money, and some days it still does, but I look back now with an understanding that it really is all His money. I give back a portion of it to His church and I'm called to use the rest to be faithful in the unique position He has placed me – at my job, in my community, with my family. With three children of my own now, I want to pass on this legacy of faith giving to them so they too can also experience all God has for them.

I've come to believe that giving is more about the act of giving then the monetary impact of the gift. Having this perspective has enabled me to trust God and let go of control and anxiety around what the church uses my tithe or offering for. Tithing and offerings are how I consistently remind myself that I've chosen to live differently, and my resources are best used for His purposes, not my own. There's real peace in that. When I give, I'm not just following a command - I'm aligning my life with how God has called me to live. Time and time again, God has proven His faithfulness.

Week 2 | Before You Go Back

Scripture: Exodus 32

When we got married, we decided that giving to our church would always be a priority. We established it as a rhythm that is part of who we are as a family. The amount has changed over time, as we've grown in our careers and in our faith, but the priority has never changed.

It hasn't always been easy. Separately, we both started giving when we were young, broke, and trying to figure out life. It may have been only a few dollars a month back then, but it created a foundation that we continue to build on. Looking back, the blessings we've received far outweigh the money we've given. During those lean times, we learned a lesson we still teach our kids: when life feels hard, go do something for someone else. It won't erase your problems, but it will shift your focus.

Helping someone else instead of dwelling on your own problems will a ways change your perspective, and maybe make it easier to understand what God is teaching you through your current challenges. It's a perfect reminder that, while you might not have it all together, God has given us each gifts that we can use to help someone else. This may not always be money - mow a neighbor's lawn, grab a cup of coffee for a coworker, give a compliment to a stranger at the store. Every time we've shifted our focus to serving others, we end up with blessings of our own, and a deepened faith that makes it easier to trust God with more.

God is the source of every ounce of success we've experienced in life, and while He doesn't need our money, He does need our faithfulness. When we trust Him more, He entrusts more to us and we joyfully give it back to Him.

Week 3 | The Shift Is In You

As a couple we have made a lot of poor decisions with our money. We have debt we shouldn't, credit scores that look like a roller coaster and our money conversations can easily turn into arguments. However, we will also both tell you how faithful God has been in His provision for us. Through moving, changing jobs, having children and all of the stuff life throws at us, He has always made a way for us. We know it is because we have consistently made one good decision - to give.

One way that we give is our "first fruits." The Bible uses a lot of farming metaphors. First fruits are the first part of a crop harvest, the first calf, first spices produced, etc. Since our jobs are not farming, we give out of our paychecks. For us that means a pay raise or a Christmas bonus is God's first. The first time a pay raise hits the bank, that whole additional amount is God's. We set up a gift online to the church and we give it back to Him! Ten percent of a Christmas bonus check is given back. It is a way to thank God for everything He has given us. It is so awesome to see what God is doing through our church and know we are blessed to be a part of that.

Week 4 | But Who Are You?

We have been married for about 30 years and have been regular church goers the entire time. We have sat through many sermons about giving, most of which made us feel like we were falling short. We knew of tithing and tithed at times, but of course, life got in the way over and over again as we struggled financially at times and could never stop worrying about our finances. Every time we started tithing and failed, we felt a sense of failure. Then God showed His faithfulness, and He changed everything for us.

We were pretty plugged in at our church and had been feeling called to go on a mission trip. The opportunity presented itself in 2017 and we began to prepare ourselves. The big challenge we faced was money to pay for it as the cost was several thousand dollars. We had no idea how we were going to afford going but we felt called, so we prayed and gave our fears up to the Lord. Well, about a week prior to having to pay for the trip, we got a letter in the mail from our mortgage company with a check for almost exactly what was needed for the mission trip. We had been overpaying into our escrow account.

We knew we had been blessed and we committed to being faithful in our giving to the Lord first from that point on. Since then, we have seen the Lord give back to us in so many ways, and not just financially. Time and time again He has shown His faithfulness towards us. We have been able to go on other mission trips, which have always helped us draw closer to Him, however, the biggest blessing has been the peace in our hearts of knowing He is in control. We can trust Him and live our lives with an open hand of giving.
